## Trusty Escapes At Vigo Jail

**Leaps From Window On Eve of Transfer**  
 TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Oct. 7 (U. P.)—A trusty at the Vigo County Jail, scheduled for transfer to the state reformatory at Pendleton to begin a term for forgery, broke away from the jailer, ripped a screen off a ground floor window, and escaped early today.

Sheriff Ira Hall said he was preparing to transport Edward Humphrey, 22, Terre Haute, to the Pendleton reformatory when the prisoner made his escape.

**Serving 2-Year Term**  
 Humphrey was convicted on a forgery charge in Vigo Circuit Court last Friday and was sentenced to a two-to-four year reformatory term. Sheriff Hall said the prisoner had "a lengthy record," including previous convictions of forgery and embezzlement.

Sheriff Hall said a jail attendant was booking another prisoner when Humphrey broke away. Being a trusty, the sheriff said, the prisoner knew his way about the jail. He ran down a corridor, knocked a screen from a window and jumped to the ground.

Indiana and Illinois state police were asked to aid in a search for him.

## Army Engineers Study River Plans

A proposal to dredge White River from Broad Ripple to Noblesville is being studied by Army Engineers today following a public meeting at Ravenswood last night.

Engineers will make a survey of the stretch of water in the next few weeks and present their findings and the proposal to Gov. Gates and the State Flood Control and Water Resources Commission.

If the program meets with the approval of state officials steps will be taken to have Congress vote the expenditure of Federal funds for the project.

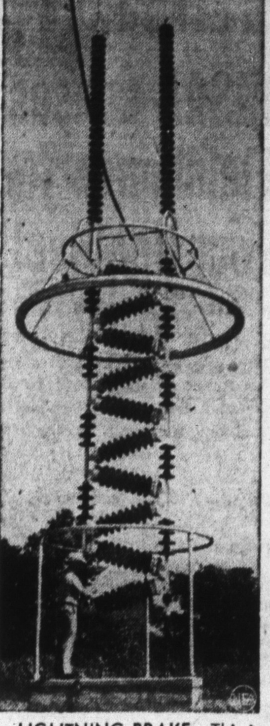
M. D. Nickel, general chairman of a group favoring the dredging project, presented the proposal to Col. B. B. Talley, U. S. District Engineer.

Marshall Abrams, executive director of the Indianapolis Construction Association, spoke of the advantages and beauty of the plan.

Others at the meeting were interested in the program only as a flood control and water conservation measure.

Opponents claimed an improved waterway would increase the motorboat traffic on the river.

**Legion Official Dies on Tour**  
 National American Legion Commander James F. O'Neill announced today that Jeremiah J. Twomey, 59, of Endover, Mass., died of a heart attack while on an inspection tour with Legion members in Rome, Italy.

Report of the death was received by Mr. O'Neill in a dispatch from Donald G. Glascoff, national adjutant of the Legion.

Mr. Twomey, chairman of a Legion subcommittee on immigration, was Mr. O'Neill's personal representative investigating the displaced persons problem in Europe. He was scheduled to report on his findings to the executive committee of the organization later this month, Mr. O'Neill said.

Mr. Twomey served as national vice commander of the Legion in 1945-46 and was Massachusetts state Legion commander from 1934-35.
