

Acquittal to Bring Beulah \$500,000

SANTA ANA, Cal., Oct. 7 (U. P.).—Helene Beulah Louise Overell's acquittal on charges of murdering her parents was worth more than \$500,000 to her, her attorneys estimated today.

Had she and George (Bud) Gollum, 21, been convicted of slaying Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. Overell, she could not have inherited their estate—valued at around \$400,000.

The 18-year-old girl also is the sole beneficiary of more than \$100,000 worth of insurance policies held by her parents.

Mounting Opposition Seen On City-County Building

Mounting opposition to the city-county municipal building was foreseen today following City Council approval of the joint agreement contract by only a narrow partisan majority.

Approval of the contract at the council meeting last night permits the City Works Board and county commissioners to proceed "immediately" with the selection of an architect to draw plans for the building.

Says Action 'Too Hasty'

William A. Brown, Democratic councilman, was first to oppose approval of the contract. He charged the council was moving too fast and that the contract approval "is the same as authorizing the bond issue."

Frank Murray, Indianapolis Taxpayers Association, also pleaded with the council to "go slow" saying "this contract absolutely ties you to the program and commits you to the bond issue immediately."

"The contract calls for immediate engagement of architects to draw plans for the building," Mr. Murray said. "A most conservative estimate of the cost of the structure is \$10 million and under the schedule set out in the contract that would mean \$600,000 to some architect. This is just another case like the recent airport enlargement program in which architects were hired and then within a few months were discharged and a new group hired."

Plans Already Drawn

One councilman stated he knew of several architect firms in the city which already had plans drawn for the city-county government building.

Mr. Murray said many persons had told him the construction money "could be better used to fight juvenile delinquency, improve street lighting and solve other civic problems."

Arthur Baxter, member of the mayor's post-war planning commission, said the city-county building project was intended to furnish employment "when the next depression hits."

Final OK Seen

However, it was the opinion of those opposing the project that they would soon be called upon to approve the bond issue.

Councilman Brown said: "This council, soon to be replaced, should not saddle the coming administration whether it be Democratic or Republican with a program it has had no part in approving."

In other action, the council passed an ordinance increasing to 30 miles an hour the speed zones in blue city. The ordinance does not apply to 20 mile zones on state highways through the city since those limits are regulated by state law.

But she still hoped for clemency. Recorder's Judge John J. Maher pronounced the sentence. He added if the court found it could recommend deportation the sentence would be suspended.

Mrs. Pearl Baker's brief stay in America has been marked by a series of misfortunes. She said she wants "more than anything else in the world" to return to her home in Worcester, England.

She admitted she and a companion used a toy pistol to rob a cab driver last March. But she protested that she had been jilted by her ex-serviceman husband and

needed the money to support her two children.

Nicholas Butler Offers

Home to Eisenhower

NEW YORK, Oct. 7 (U. P.).—Nicholas Murray Butler solved Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's housing problem today.

The president emeritus of Columbia University offered to relinquish the president's house on the university campus, to Gen. Eisenhower when the general becomes president of Columbia next year.

When Mr. Butler retired in 1945 he was given permission to live in the president's house for the rest of his life.

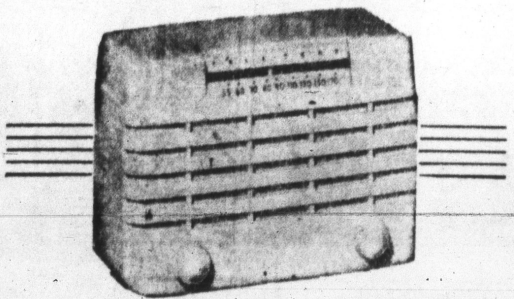

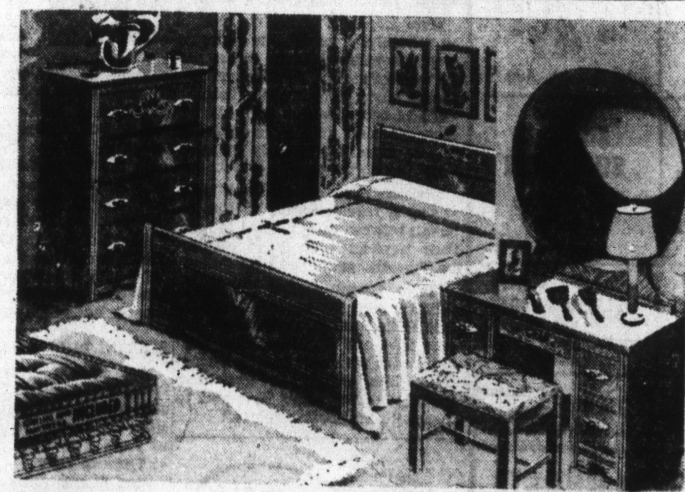
