LOS ANGELES, Oct. 7 (U. P.).—Hanns Eisler, film composer charged with concealing Communist affiliations, and his wife, Louise, were free on bail today pending a deportation hearing.  
The bespectacled, German-born musician whose brother, Gerhart Eisler, has been called the "brains" behind U. S. Communists, appeared yesterday with his wife before District Immigration Director William A. Carmichael.  
His bail was set at \$1000 and her's at \$500. Date for a hearing will be set later.

Mr. Hoffenstein, 57, came to the United States from Lithuania when he was 4 years old. He was on the staff of the New York Sun for 20 years. He was a drama critic, magazine writer and later turned to playwriting.  
His books included "Poems in Praise of Practically Nothing," and "Pencil in the Air," which is scheduled for publication this week. Mr. Hoffenstein wrote screen plays for "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde," "An American Tragedy," "Laura," "Cluny Brown," and "The Great Waltz."


