

No Kissing In Latin Film

Argentine Picture Bans Shooting, Too

United Press Hollywood, Oct. 24.—There used to be two kinds of pictures: kissing pictures and shooting pictures.

Now comes M-G-M with a movie without either kissing or shooting. That hard-headed studio has bought the first Argentine picture ever imported here and hired its director, young Hugo Fregonese (Freg-O-Nessy), first South American director ever contracted by a major Hollywood studio, to teach Hollywood how to make movies the South American way.

Strictly High Class
The South American way is strictly high class and should bring benedictions from critics of U. S. film morals, Mr. Fregonese's backers believe.

There is no censorship in Argentina. If the customers don't like a picture, they grunt in Spanish, throw away their popcorn and get a refund at the box office.

"Public taste will break the producer of any offensive picture," Mr. Fregonese, 33, small and with crisp, curly black hair but no mustache, said.

The gunless, kissless wonder M-G-M is preparing to distribute in this country is "Where Words Fail." It swept South America like a pampas fire and is "the biggest thing since Luis Angel Firpo," M-G-M will admit at the drop of a sombrero.

No "Hot Love Scenes"
The picture has an all-Argentine cast, complete ballet, piano concertos and symphony orchestra. It cost only \$75,000 to produce, but "the ballet scenes would have cost M-G-M \$250,000 alone, if made in Hollywood," Mr. Fregonese estimated.

The only "love" in the picture is father for daughter and adopted son. United Artists already has a deal on for six South American movies, but none of them will have a single "hot love scene" or enough gunplay to drown out the noise of a small bowl of rice krispies.

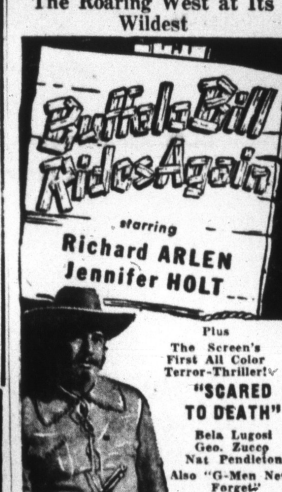

1 cake compressed yeast
2 cups scalded milk, cooled to lukewarm
7 cups E-Z-BAKE Flour
4 eggs
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla, rind of lemon, grated
1 teaspoon salt
Dissolve yeast in milk, add 2 cups flour; let stand in warm place about 1 1/2 hours. Beat egg salt together until light, add to first mixture. Add butter. Add remaining flour, beat well; cover and let rise until double in bulk. Put on floured board; pat until dough is 1/2-inch thick. Cut with doughnut cutter and let rise 15 minutes. Fry in deep fat (375° to 385°F) about 3 minutes.
