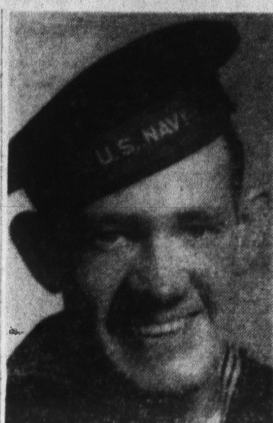

Will Be Returned Here****Ed Howerton Parents
Move to Indianapolis**The army today announced that
the body of an Evansville sailor
killed in the Pacific will be re-
turned here with Indianapolis war
dead.The body of Aviation Machinist's
Mate 3c Ed David Howerton, for-
merly of Evansville, will be sent to
Indianapolis instead of Evansville
as originally scheduled.His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul
Howerton, formerly of Evansville,
now reside at 910 N. Keystone Ave.The body of the 24-year-old sea-
man who died of wounds July 8,
1945, in the South Pacific was re-
turned aboard the Honda Knot.He is survived by his parents and
two sisters, Miss Pauline Howerton
and Mrs. Laura Mae French, both
of Indianapolis.Services will be held at Jordan
funeral home and burial will be in
Crown Hill.**WAR HERO**—The body of

Due Tomorrow****Ira Lee Among First
Local Youths to Enlist**An 18-year-old youth who was
one of the first to enlist for serv-
ice the day after Pearl Harbor will
be the first of Indianapolis repa-
triated war dead to return home.The Army today announced that
it will return the body of Seaman
2C Ira Lincoln Lee, son of Aubert
D. Lee, 1542 Craft St., tomorrow.The illness of the boy's father
necessitated the special move.**Father Tried to Enlist**Mr. Lee, who tried to enlist with
his son and who later succeeded in
entering service after his son's
death, is scheduled to go to Vet-
erans' Hospital in Chicago Tues-
day.Seaman Lee was a student at
Manual High School on Dec. 7,
1941 when the Japanese attacked
Pearl Harbor. The next morning
he and his father were among the
first at the naval recruiting office
to enlist.The youth was accepted but Mr.
Lee was rejected. Then on July
17, 1942, his son was fatally injured
in an accident aboard ship in New
Zealand and died the next day.**Accepted in September**Mr. Lee succeeded in enlisting in
September following his son's death
and served with the Navy eightmonths. He is the only immediate
survivor.An honor guard from Memorial
Post, American Legion, will meet
the train at 1:05 p. m. tomorrow
and escort the hero's body to G.
H. Herrmann funeral home. It
will lie in state there with an honor
guard from 10 a. m. Sunday
throughout the rest of the day.The Rev. Frank C. Wicks will
officiate at services at 1:30 p. m.
Monday and the Legion will con-
duct military rites at Crown Hill
Cemetery.**Grain Boost Laid
To High Margin**MUSCATINE, Iowa, Oct. 24 (UP).
J. O. McClintock, president of the
Chicago Board of Trade blamed in-
creased margin requirements on
wheat futures for climbing grain
prices today."Wheat futures have risen to their
present highs as a result of the 33 1/2
per cent margin required of specu-
lators by the government," he said.He explained that government
purchases of cash wheat never had
been at figures as low as the fu-
tures prices. He defended specu-
lators as having the effect of level-
ing off distribution by trading in
the futures market.He warned the Kiwanis Club at
a meeting yesterday that if specu-
lators were eliminated prices might
