

Veteran With 2 Wives Guilty In Pay Fraud

Sentenced to Year; Scored by Judge

Failure of a 31-year-old Indianapolis veteran to check Court House divorce records before marrying a second time was held today to be "more than negligence" by Federal Judge Robert C. Baltzell.

The veteran, Robert J. Lee, 904½ Ft. Wayne Ave., was sentenced to a year and one day imprisonment on a guilty plea that he made a false statement in claiming government family allowance.

While in the army, Lee listed a second wife as a dependent in the belief that an earlier marriage had been dissolved, he told Judge Baltzell.

No. 2 Collected \$1040

The second wife told Judge Baltzell she collected \$1040 in allowance. Lee, who quit school in the eighth grade, testified that an uncle of his first wife told him that she had obtained a divorce.

"Anyone in good faith would have checked the Court House," declared Judge Baltzell, "instead of taking this uncle's word. There is just no excuse for this sort of thing."

Obtains Divorce

The first wife, whom Lee has not seen in three years, obtained a divorce, Lee's attorney said, after his second marriage.

A mail fraud indictment against a Cicero housewife with five small children was dismissed by the government after she pleaded not guilty. The housewife, Mrs. Fredia Lisenbauer, and her husband, Albert, were charged jointly. He changed his plea from not guilty to guilty and the case was referred to a federal probation officer for pre-sentence investigation.

Two defendants charged with the interstate transportation of stolen vehicles pleaded guilty. Smith Miles, Biloxi, Miss., was sentenced to two years imprisonment while the case of Delmar L. Carter, Monticello, Ky., an AWOL soldier, was referred to a federal probation officer for pre-sentence investigation.

The trial of M. Bernard Raub, charged with attempted income tax evasion, was set for Nov. 12. He pleaded not guilty.

A material witness in a white slave case to be heard Nov. 20 in Milwaukee, Wis., was ordered held under \$2500 bond and transported there. She is Violet Marie Richardson, Indianapolis.

2d Reyman Trial Jury Dismissed

ATLANTA, Ga., Oct. 24 (UPI)—Taxi-driver Glenn Robinson today faced the possibility of being tried a third time for the rape-slaying of pretty Mrs. Jeanette Reyman, formerly of Winchester, Ind., after court action in the case ended in a mistrial for the second time in a month.

Judge Frank Hooper ruled a mistrial late last night when the jury reported a 7-5 deadlock after nearly seven hours of deliberation.

Robinson's first trial had a similar ending in mid-September when the first jury faced an 8-4 stymie.

Robinson is charged with the murder of Mrs. Reyman, wife of a Bogart, Ga., tourist camp operator, whose beaten and ravished body was found stuffed into the rear of her pickup truck here last June 26.

Conn Jr., both of Villa Grove, and five sisters, Mrs. Harold Kull, Lawrenceville, Ill.; Mrs. Morris Mullinax, Anderson, and Mrs. Floyd Huff, Mrs. Robert Meintz and Miss Mary Conn, all of Villa Grove.


