Dr. Nafe Becomes President Of State Physicians Today

Dr. Cleon A. Nafe, Indianapolis surgeon, took office as president of the Indiana State Medical Association today, succeeding Dr. Floyd T. Remberger of Lafayette.

Dr. Nafe, a graduate of Indiana University Medical School, served four years as superintendent of Indianapolis General Hospital and since has been in private practice here for more than 22 years.

In 1945 Dr. Nafe served as president of the Indianapolis Medical Society and has been active in state medical association work, having served 10 years as chairman of the executive committee.

He is a member of the American College of Surgeons, the Western Surgical Association, the Central Surgical Association, American Gastro Association, American Medical Association, and past president of the National Conference of Medical Service.


Taking office with Dr. Nafe is Dr. A. F. Weyerbacher of Indianapolis who begins his 17th term as treasurer.

12 States Tighten Child Labor Laws

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Labor Department general that 1947 legislatures "strengthened" the child labor laws in 12 states and "lowered" the standards in three others.

The department said in a survey that "the results were below expectations."

Alabama became the 18th state to establish a basic 16-year minimum for employment of minors and the Illinois law of 1945 fixing

that minimum became effective last June 30.

The department said states which strengthened child labor laws were Alabama, Massachusetts, Connecticut, New York, Ohio, Michigan, New Jersey, Minnesota, Maine, North Dakota, Wisconsin and Hawaii.

Standards were lowered in Florida, Pennsylvania and Texas. Also included in the latter group because of relaxations were several states which had improved some parts of their laws. They included Ohio, Massachusetts and Michigan.

Computory school attendance laws were made stronger in Maryland, Michigan and Tennessee, the department said.
