battle still ahead for the European Recovery Program.

The President remained firm, however, in his belief that Congress should approve a four-year program and put up \$6,800,000,000 for the first 15 months of its operation.

GOP Outlook Bright On Income Tax Cut

Chairman Harold Knutson (R. Minn.) of the House Ways and Means Committee predicted his bill to cut personal income taxes \$5,600,000,000 would be the first major piece of legislation to win House approval.

He believes his committee will okay it next week.

Speaker Joseph W. Martin Jr. (R. Miss.) said he hoped for final passage sometime this month. Mr. Martin said "continuation of war-time taxes in peacetime is intolerable and indefensible."

Truman Budget Called 'Too High'

House GOP Economy Chief John Taber (R. N. Y.) said the President's reported new budget of about \$41 billion is "too damn high."

Mr. Taber, who is chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, said he'd like to cut that figure in half, but conceded that it probably would be out of the question.

He said his committee would make the administration justify "every cent spent for foreign aid." His other economy targets, he said, will be the Veterans Administration and the armed forces.

Probers Get Complete Data on Graham

The brokerage firm handling the commodity market account of Brig. Gen. Wallace H. Graham today turned over to a Senate subcommittee complete data on the White House doctor's commodity speculation.

A representative of the firm—Bache & Co.—appeared at a private session of the Senate Speculation Subcommittee to explain "a couple

of entries" in Gen. Graham's account.

WALLA WALLA, Wash., Jan. 6.—An Indiana criminal investigation agent today was on his way to Washington State Penitentiary here to question Jake Bird, confessed slayer of three members of a South Bend family.

W. L. Welch left Tacoma for the prison to question Bird about the triple slaying of a "South Bend watchman, his wife and child in September, 1942.

Bird, who is awaiting hanging for a double slaying, has confessed to 13 other murders. His execution may be delayed to permit questioning by law enforcement officials from several states on details of his 20 years of cross-country murders and maraudings.
