

Replace Hollywood Tarzans With Lujack, 'Ike' Fans Cry

HOLLYWOOD, Jan. 6.—A local Tarzan club, which has been seething for five years over movie versions of their idol, came out in the open today and blasted all Hollywood Tarzans as "fumbling bums who run around naked, grunt, and chase scantly clad females up trees."

"They, growled the members, don't come anywhere near the intelligent gentleman" Edgar Rice Burroughs had in mind when he created the jungle man.

"We started boycotting Tarzan movies back in 1942," President Thomas E. Abraham said. "And that goes for those guys like Johnny Weissmuller, Buster Crabbe, Herman Brix, Elmo Lincoln, and any other muscle-men who've played the role."

Mr. Abraham, a 26-year-old aviation designer, said he and 10 other engineers got together about five years ago to compare gripes on what Hollywood was doing to their hero.

Love Jungle Stories

"We discovered we all loved the jungle stories," he explained. "One of the fellows had taken a little psychology and got to talking about escape mechanisms and pretty soon we were meeting about once a week to read Burroughs' books. They were good escapist material from jet propulsion and stress and strain theorems."

Not so the Tarzan movies.

"They made us sick," Mr. Abraham said. "Burroughs saw Tarzan as an intelligent gentleman who, when given his choice, turned to the jungle as his natural habitat. When Hollywood gets through with him he's an inarticulate, grunting swimming champion intent on luring scantly-clad female morons up a tree."
