Mars Hill School Crisis Draws Parental Fire

(Continued From Page One) In the afternoon, was inaugurated in September. Parents were originally informed that it would last only until October, when the annexes being added to each end of the old school would be finished.

"We're getting fed up with it, a group of indignant mothers complained to The Times. 'Our children are falling behind in their work, their grades are dropping and they're losing interest.'"

"We were willing to co-operate when we thought the school would be finished soon. But all we've gotten is one excuse after another—labor trouble, can't get material, unsuitable weather. But other buildings are being finished every day and we can't see why they can't do the same at Mars Hill."

A typical example is 8-year-old Sharon Ann Chamberlin, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Orval Chamberlin, 1144 S. Somerset Ave.

Sharon is a "bus child." That means she lives a distance from school and must ride the bus on its winding route over the West Side and through Tyndall Town before she reaches school.

If the weather's not too bad and the driver has no difficulty negotiating his winding route, Sharon gets to school by 8:15.

She takes off her wraps, is unable to find a spot on temporary

racks in the hall and takes them into her fourth grade room, piling them with others on a table.

By this time Sharon has missed almost a half hour of concentrated schooling. She's a little bewildered by what the class is doing because she couldn't take her text books home to study yesterday.

Although her parents rent a book for her, it's rented by another child in the "second shift."

Just as she begins to pick up the thread of class work it's quarter to 12, time for her to hunt out her wraps and hurry out to catch the bus.

Mothers Protest Mothers staged an "indignation meeting" yesterday at the home of Mrs. Van Shellen, 3722 W. Morris St. Even as they met, their children, all morning students, played in the rear and a tinkling of glass sounded the death knell for a rear window.

"The devil finds rocks for idle children to throw," one quipped. Every one present had a gripe.

The school, too, is concerned with the problem.

Wayne township trustee Samuel W. Johnson, has worn himself out trying to hurry contractors. Principal Orval Hendrickson has a desk in the hall, surrounded by noisy children and noisier carpenters.

The contractors are almost finished but they can't get plumbing and they can't get sheet metal. Otherwise they could get out of there.

And the teachers are worn out. They have an enrollment of 880, compared to 300 in pre-war times.

Cite Teacher's Problem An example of the teacher's problem is Miss Jane Cones, in the first grade. The first grade is the most crowded, 110 students in all. Miss Cones teaches 40 children in the morning while another teacher takes 40. She then tries to stuff in a quick lunch where no lunch hour is provided and teaches 30 listless beginners in the afternoon.

"The morning is so crowded and hectic," she says. "And the afternoon drags. These little tots—they're little more than babies—have played all morning and they're tired out by afternoon."

"They shouldn't stay longer than 3 o'clock anyway and that last hour they're almost asleep."
