VENICE, Cal., Jan. 7 (UP)—A former specialty girl in the Zigfield Follies promised today that she would make Milwaukee "merrier, mightier and more modern" if she is elected mayor.

Mrs. Ruth Foster Foremning said she will leave today for Milwaukee to begin her campaign for the job now held by 80-year-old Mayor John Bohn.

She is the first woman in the city's history to file for the office. She said her non-partisan campaign would be based on a pledge to increase human and animal welfare in the city.

Mrs. Foremning is one of 11 candidates for the job.

She said she is proud of the fact that she is a former Follies girl. She had a part in the 1919 Follies production of "a pretty girl is like a melody."

A year after the 1919 Follies, Mrs. Foremning was selected as the "prettiest girl in Wisconsin." She later married Maj. Paul Foremning, now head of the Veterans' Hospital at suburban Woods, Wis.
