

# 8-Day Observance of Youth Week Planned by Protestant Groups Here

Mass Meeting Feb. 1 To Climax Events

Young people of the Protestant churches of the city will mark an eight-day Youth Week beginning tomorrow.

Youth groups of the Presbyterian Churches of the community will open the week with their 33rd annual Midwinter Conference tomorrow through Wednesday in the Irvington Presbyterian Church. Youth Fellowship of all the Methodist Churches in the Indianapolis District will hold a rally Tuesday at 7 p. m. in the North Methodist Church.

Youth Week will come to a festive climax with an interdenominational mass meeting Feb. 1 in the historic Second Presbyterian Church. This is the pulpit from which Dr. Henry Ward Beecher once preached as pastor.

Mass Meeting on Sunday Next Sunday's mass meeting will be sponsored by the United Christian Youth Council of the Church Federation. Miss Helen Spaulding of the United Christian Youth Movement, Chicago, will speak, and Daniel R. Shale, head of the department of religious education for the Church Federation, is handling the arrangements.

Approximately five million young people in the United States and Canada will celebrate Youth Week in some special manner. "Jesus Christ Is Lord." This slogan key-note last summer's second World Conference of Christian Youth in Oslo, Norway.

Individual churches and groups will hold Youth Week institutes, forums, prayer cells, and a variety of social events to promote fellowship.

The Presbyterian meeting schedules classes, fellowship dinners, addresses by speakers of note, and a closing communion service. A few of the topics for study are: "Why Are We Protestants?", "Investing My Time," "What Is This Christian Religion?", "How to Use the Bible," and "Managing My Money."

Several Speakers Listed Speakers to be heard are the Rev. Ray Cloyd Downs of New York, director of youth work for the denomination's department of foreign missions; Miss Anna Stout, teacher in Crispus Attucks High School; the Rev. Roy Linberg, director of Hillcrest Neighborhood House, Clinton, Ind.; and J. M. Guest, manager of Camp Koscusko, Winona Lake.

The Rev. E. V. Andrews is in charge of the conference and Mrs. Ralph Jones, of arrangements.

Young people of the Indianapolis Methodist District are calling Tuesday night's meeting "The Cleveland Follow-Up Rally." At the meeting, they will show exhibits and give reports of the recent Methodist Youth Rally in Cleveland, O., one of the largest youth meetings ever held in the history of the United States.

The Rev. E. V. Andrews, president, will preside, and "Bud" Niehaus will lead the singing. A recording titled "Youth in Conversation" will bring the session to a close. Miriam Ayers is chairman of arrangements.

Editor on Schedule Dr. Raymond M. Voh of Harrisburg, Pa., editor of Builders, youth paper of the Evangelical United Brethren Church, will speak at a rally of the denomination's young people tomorrow at 2:30 p. m. in the Brookside Church. Dr. Voh also will be heard at the 9 a. m. service and 6 p. m. vespers tomorrow in the University Heights Evangelical United Brethren Church.

The celebration of Youth Week at the Downey Avenue Christian Church serves as an example of an Indianapolis church dedicating Sunday and week-days to the observance.
