A 3 per cent annual dividend has been declared by the Aresenal Building & Loan Association.

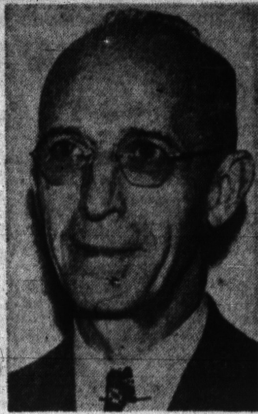
According to statements by officials, the company has not failed to pay a dividend for 62 years.

Quake-Torn City Now Ghost Town

MANILA, Jan. 27 (UP)—Thousands of residents of Iloilo City have fled to the countryside and refused to return today as a result of terror inspired by three new shocks that rocked the quake-torn city just before midnight.

After the death of one of the 100 persons injured, the toll of dead mounted to 21.

The new tremors set off a wave of wild rumors and terror. Residents fled into the streets from houses, hospitals and theaters. Entire sections of the city were deserted in an exodus to outlying suburbs.

Thousands spent the night in public plazas and others abandoned the city entirely, driven to panic by rumors that further quakes and tidal waves were on the way.

Police Here Seize Murder Suspect

Acting on information received by telegram, detectives today captured two out-of-state fugitives.

Homicide squad officers arrested Gene Legg, Columbia, Tenn., at 2370 Hillside Ave. Legg is wanted in Maury County, Tennessee, on a charge of murder and highway robbery. A Maury County officer will return him to Tennessee.

Willie Ware, a fugitive from Dowagiac, Mich., was taken into custody at 2152 N. Arsenal Ave. Michigan authorities had reported him at the home of his mother, Mrs. Ida Griffin, 2150 N. Arsenal Ave. He is wanted on a charge of assault and battery with intent to kill.

Fighting Mounts in Fury In China's Winter War

SHANGHAI, Jan. 27 (UP)—The bloodiest fighting of the winter in China's bitter civil war mounted in fury today as both Communists and the government stepped up attacks in Manchuria and North China.

Nationalist dispatches described increasingly heavy losses on both sides as columns of fighting men maneuvered for strategic positions along China's many war fronts.

The battle for Hsinlinitun, the western gateway to Mukden, went into its fifth day with the Reds fighting through the city's streets toward the central railway station.


