## Vincennes Promised Protection From Wabash

VINCENNES, Feb. 5 (UP)—Plans for a project to ease flood danger to Vincennes from the overflow of the Wabash River were being prepared today by the Army Engineers.

Blueprints for the flood control work will be drawn up immediately, announced Mayor William L. Betz after a conference with the district engineer of the Army Corps at Louisville, Ky.

Construction probably won't get under way before July 1, 1949, he said. The project will be divided into two sections, one part to be a flood wall along the northside of the city and the second part to be protection works in the east and south areas of Vincennes.
