### Living Costs Rise As Mercury Dips

Cold Weather Nips Truck Crops in South

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5—Dropping mercury in the country's thermometers is due to signal another hike in the cost of living, this time in vegetables raised in the south for markets in the north.

It got as low as six degrees below zero Fahrenheit in El Paso, Tex., which is the coldest on record for that station, the U. S. weather bureau reports.

That means that truck crops now in the field have suffered severe damage. The losses from cold extends clear out into Southern California. But there'll be no floats from the Florida State Chamber of Commerce; Florida has been shivering, too.

A storm area that started to work its way up the Atlantic coast brought heavy snow, sleet and freezing rain into the Carolinas and southern Virginia. It was Dixie's own snowstorm, however; it veered off the coast before it neared the Mason-Dixon line, and left the weatherman in Washington holding the bag for a predicted snowstorm that never arrived.

The big North Atlantic storm that held up steamer arrivals as much as five days has already passed over Iceland, and will probably be heard from next off northern Norway and maybe Spitsbergen. It was a terror while it lasted, with hurricane force reported from one Iceland observatory, and near-hurricane force observed aboard several ships south of that storm-beaten land.
