

Labor Shortage Faces U. S. Farms

Washington Parley To Study Problem

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18.—American farmers are wondering where they will find ample labor to meet food production goals that have been raised to new heights in anticipation of heavy foreign aid this year.

Representatives of agriculture from the 48 states will meet here next Friday, Feb. 20, at the request of the U. S. Employment Service to discuss the problem. They will represent agriculture manpower advisory committees organized in each state on USES request.

Edward K. Keenan, USES deputy director, believes the problem probably will require importation of a considerable amount of Mexican labor this year. These workers would be for western states, principally for vegetable farming. The need for these workers was indicated at a recently concluded series of regional manpower meetings, Mr. Keenan said.

8. Consult your doctor and your oculist.

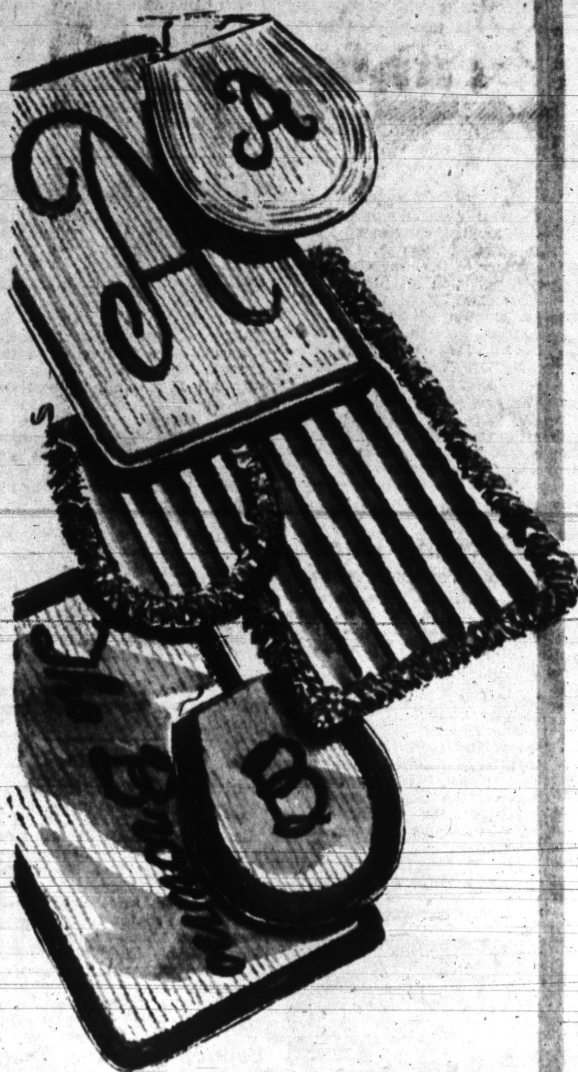
9. Leave the country and get to know this vast world of which you are so ignorant.

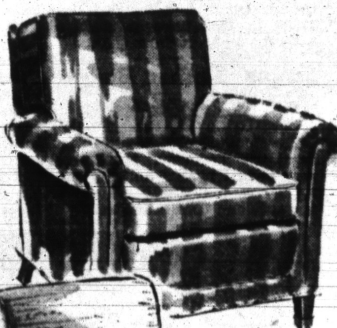

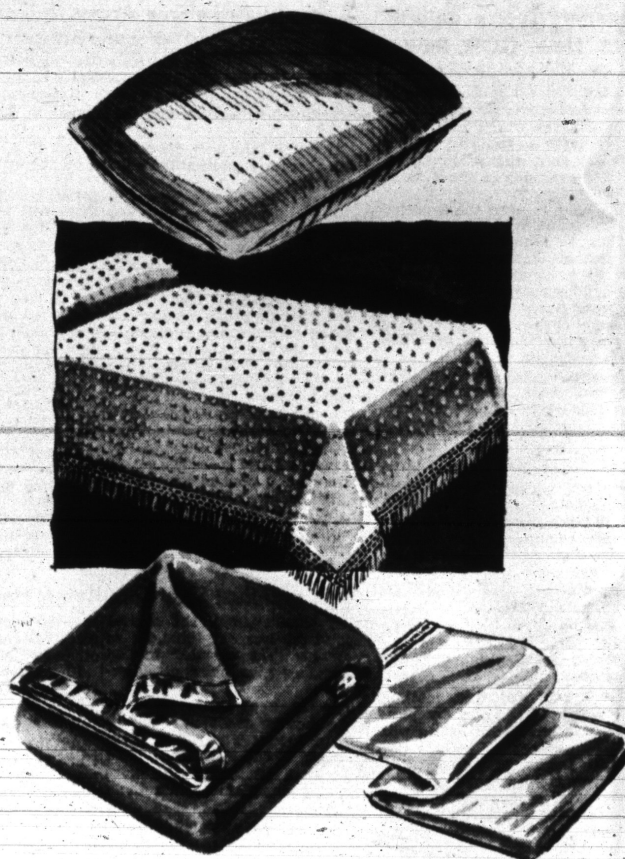
