For War Hero**

**Pvt. John Sauter Jr.
Killed on Oahu Isle**

Services for Private John Sauter Jr., injured fatally in Hawaii June 16, 1942, will be held at 2 p.m. tomorrow in the Lauck funeral home. Burial will be in St. Joseph Cemetery. He was 24. His body was returned here from the South Pacific area.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. John B. Sauter, 2254 Union St., Private Sauter lost his life in trying to rescue a pilot and passenger of a burning airplane. He was given a posthumous Army medal for heroism.

Rescue Attempt Fails

The plane was carrying a live bomb when Private Sauter and five others made the rescue attempt on the island of Oahu. They braved burning gasoline and exploding ammunition. Another soldier was killed in the blast which followed a moment later.

A buddy of Private Sauter wrote to his parents:

"He died a true soldier and a hero. Johnny was one who could lay down his life for a friend."

An Indianapolis native, Private Sauter was graduated from Sacred Heart High School and was active in Catholic youth organizations.

Besides his parents, survivors include a brother, Walter, and two sisters, Mrs. Louise Selzer and Miss Ann Sauter.
