

N. Hampshire Primary Test For Stassen

Dewey Showdown Slated Tomorrow

 CONCORD, N. H., Mar. 8—New Hampshire's most stirring presidential primary in years tomorrow should show whether Harold Stassen's recent gains have dented the deep-rooted appeal which has made Gov. Thomas E. Dewey a Republican boss-man in public opinion polls.

Native political observers agreed around many a pot-bellied stove in this wintry state today that Mr. Stassen's drive for delegates to the Republican national convention has improved his chances in this last fortnight. With hard Yankee caution many yield Mr. Dewey an edge but some contend that a Stassen victory is not out of the question.

Townships Meet
 Tomorrow is "Town Meeting" day in New Hampshire's 224 organized townships. The folks get together to choose selectmen, decide how their tax money is to be spent in the next year and give a piece of their mind to anyone they think is not performing just right.

The fact that "Town Meeting" day coincides with the primary election should mean a fairly good vote in the towns.

Mr. Dewey lined up with the state GOP organization headed by Gov. Charles M. Dale and tied into local organizations in cities and towns. It is the orthodox political approach that is especially effective in primaries where the vote is relatively small.

Mr. Stassen's campaign was built on personal appearances here—answering questions, pumping hands, making friends—and on a less professional but perhaps more enthusiastic stage organization than Mr. Dewey has. Five hundred volunteer Stassen "Paul Revere Riders" combed the state over the week-end, for example, in a last-minute drive.

Important Test
 This will not be altogether a straight Dewey-Stassen test. Thousands will vote for delegates—eight are to be chosen—less as Dewey or Stassen men than as personalities in this small state. Because of New Hampshire law, most candidates are running unpledged and their names do not appear on the ballot linked to either Mr. Dewey or Mr. Stassen. To offset this, both camps have put out bushels of small cards showing which men they are supporting.

Whatever strength Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower has—notwithstanding his withdrawal from the presidential race—may show up in the votes for two delegates.

Fatal Shots at Floor Show Far From 'Part of the Act'

Detroit Night Club Patrons Deceived As 3 Bullets Find Heart of Mother of Six

DETROIT, Mar. 8 (UP)—Police today captured a 28-year-old steel worker accused of barging into a dim suburban night club while floor show comedians put on a humorous "love triangle" skit, and killing his wife with a fusillade of shots that also wounded her companion.

Homer Caldwell was seized near his rooming house nine hours after he was alleged to have drawn a gun in the club and cried:

"She's my wife. They both have a revolver. Then he brandished his gun and warned two patrons who approached him to stand back.

"Take it easy," he told them. "I've got two bullets left in here. Keep away or I'll let you have it."

He bounded out the door and escaped down an alley. Some 100 customers of the Coolidge Inn Club gaped for a moment, then grabbed their wraps and ran, too.

Detective Lieutenant Louis Balazs said Mrs. Caldwell was the mother of six children and had been separated from her husband five or six times in the last two years.

According to police, Caldwell entered the club shortly before midnight and blazed away with a

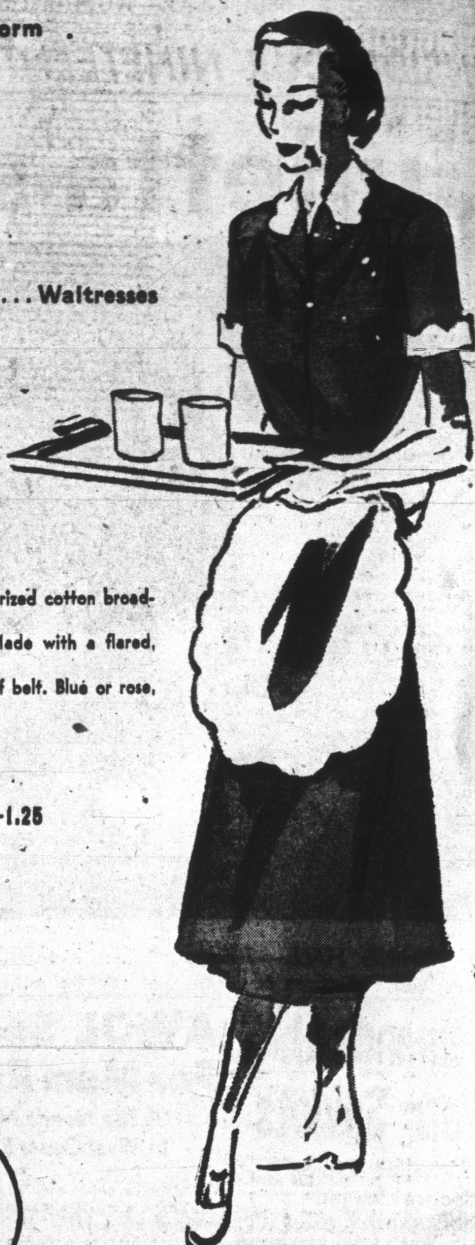

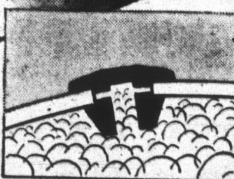

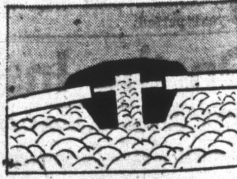
