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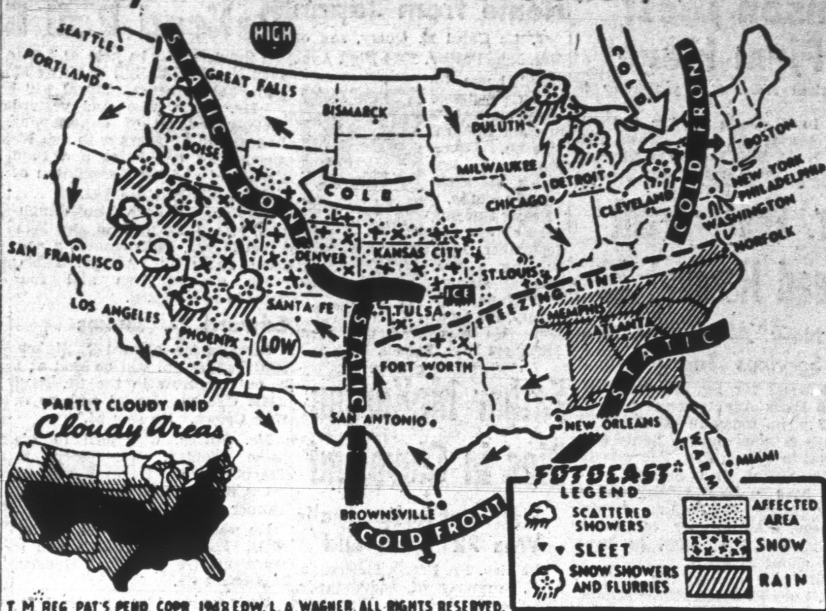
MacArthur Calls Russ No. 1 Issue

**Favors Holding
Talks With Stalin**

TOKYO, Mar. 9.—Observers believe Gen. Douglas MacArthur, if nominated by the Republicans, would campaign on a platform of vigorously opposing further Russian expansion.
Gen. MacArthur is known to believe that direct man-to-man negotiations between the President of the United States and Premier Josef Stalin should be attempted.
In the opinion of those who have talked with him, he would, if nominated, favor placing the American anti-Communist program upon an immediate global basis.
Gen. MacArthur's views on leading issues, as expressed to numerous visitors in conversations in which this correspondent participated are as follows:
ONE: The greatest single problem facing the American people is that of relations with Russia.
TWO: This problem should not be considered insoluble by peaceful means.
THREE: Direct man-to-man negotiations between the President of the United States and Stalin should be attempted.
FOUR: The United States should make it unmistakably clear that Washington is prepared to use whatever methods may be necessary to defend the American way of life.
FIVE: There are some grounds for belief that Moscow would retreat if the United States declared its determination to use the strongest methods to prevent further Soviet aggression.

TONIGHT AND TOMORROW—Temperatures over the northern half of the nation from the Rockies to the Atlantic will be colder than seasonal normals, by Wednesday morning, weather experts say. See that cold arrow at the upper center of the Fotocast. It shows the path frigid-cold Canadian blasts will travel down into the north-central states bringing sub-zero weather with early morning temperatures 15 to 20 degrees colder than the seasonal averages in the Dakotas and Montana. Cold west to northwest winds, indicated by small, solid black arrows, will send the mercury down into the 20's all the way from Boston to Philadelphia, through the Ohio Valley and Missouri early tomorrow morning.

Milk Producers Say It's Fun To Color Oleo at Home

WASHINGTON, Mar. 9.—Do you, Mrs. Housewife, have fun coloring your margarine at home?
The National Co-Operative Milk Producers Association suggests you actually have a rollicking good time if you buy the kind of margarine you color by kneading the bag. So why all the bother? greenmen in opposing the proposed repeal of federal taxes on margarine.
"Modern packaging makes it possible for the housewife to color oleo easily, quickly and without waste. As one (margarine) manufacturer says, it is 'actually fun.'"
Insult to Injury
This statement, shouted Rep. W. R. Poage (D. Tex.) before the House Agriculture Committee, "adds insult to injury."
"If they sincerely believe that," he said, "why don't they put the color in a pill and sell it with their butter rather than mixing it in before offering it to the public? Why do they deny this 'actual fun' to their customers?"
The Waco Congressman was one of a number of witnesses appearing before the House committee in favor of a blanket repeal of all federal taxes on margarine. Hearings on 18 bills proposing repeal or a reduction of the taxes will continue through this week, with opponents of repeal being heard last.
Butter Colored Also
Rep. Poage said practically all butter sold was artificially colored but that he was not asking that colored butter be so labeled. He said he was willing to leave this requirement on margarine, however, being sure that the product could stand on its own feet.
The hearings were at times uproarious, at times bitter.
At one stage, Rep. Orville Zimmerman (D. Mo.) shouted at Rep. Reid Murray (R. Wis.): "You represent the dairy interests, don't you?"
"No," replied Rep. Murray.
The packed hearing room rang with laughter at this denial.

Employee of U. S. Consulate Held

PRAGUE, Mar. 9 (UP).—The U. S. Embassy said today that Joseph Spiro, a Slovak employee of the American Consulate in Bratislava, has been arrested by police on conspiracy charges.
The Embassy said Spiro, a secretary and translator, was being held in Bratislava prison for questioning.
Embassy officials said Spiro has no claim to American citizenship. He was employed by Vice Consul Claiborne Fell as an interpreter some months before the consulate was opened officially on Mar. 1.
Spiro was arrested Monday night, an Embassy spokesman said. U. S. Ambassador Laurence A. Steinhardt has inquired at the Czechoslovak foreign office concerning the exact charges against him.

2 Red Leaders Surrender in China

NANKING, Mar. 9 (UP).—Two Chinese Communist commanders have surrendered themselves and their 8000 men to the Nationalists, the government's official Central Daily News said today.
The surrender took place on the Chahar-Jehol and Chahar-Shansi border regions. Central said, when Lou Kuan-Chun and Sun Chen-Yuan handed their swords to Gen. Fu Tso-Yi's "ever-victorious" forces.
The two commanders, in a surrender message, attacked their former Communist comrades for indulging in treason against the state. Central said they would send representatives to Nanking to ask for a pardon from the Nationalist government.

8 Escaped Convicts Still Loose in Georgia

ATLANTA, Ga., Mar. 9 (UP).—Eight escapees were still at large today after a mass break of 19 prisoners from the nearby DeKalb County work camp Sunday afternoon.
Nine were recaptured within five hours of the break.

Trapped Gunman Kills N. Y. Officer

NEW YORK, Mar. 9 (UP).—One policeman was killed and another critically wounded today by an unidentified gunman they were attempting to question.
Patrolman Julius Mirell, 26, The Bronx, was killed when he followed the gunman into the basement of an uptown Manhattan business building shortly before dawn. When he called for the man to come out Officer Mirell was killed instantly by a blast of gunfire.
Patrolman Jacob Zuckerman, 32, attracted by the shooting, saw the gunman fleeing down the street.
When Officer Zuckerman called for him to halt, the gunman opened fire again, wounding the policeman in the left arm and twice in the chest.
Officer Luckerman collapsed after firing six shots at the fleeing gunman. Two suspects were being questioned by police.
