NEW YORK, Mar. 9 (UP)—Carl Liscombe, record-busting winger of the Providence Reds, today boasted 104 total points in 63 games as he continued his run-away dash to the American Hockey League's 1947-48 individual scoring title.

Liscombe had 44 goals, the league's best, and 60 assists, according to the latest official statistics. After breaking Wally Kilrea's A. H. L. mark of 99 total points last week, Liscombe now hopes to overhaul the league record of 52 goals during the final two weeks of the season. The mark was set by Johnny Holota of Cleveland last year.

Cliff Simpson of Indianapolis held the runner-up spot, 10 points behind Liscombe.

Phil Samis of Pittsburgh remained the leading roughhouse player with 162 minutes in the penalty box and teammates Baz Bastien paced the netminders with a 2.57 average.
