

Cancer Society Told of Progress

William Ball Speaks On Co-operative Effort

The program of the Indiana Cancer Society calls for relief, re-education and research, and progress is being made along each of these lines, William Ball of Muncie, president of the society told a state-wide meeting yesterday noon in the Columbia Club.

Mr. Ball told of the society's co-operative efforts with Indiana and Purdue medical schools at the all-day session attended by more than 200 representatives of the county Cancer Societies over the state.

He said instructive pamphlets were being distributed to assist in early diagnosis and that important strides were being made in the checking of the disease.

Strong Health Program

Gov. Gates said when he took office the per capita health expenditures of the state amounted to only 10 cents per person. This, he said, has been increased to a point of effectiveness and that when he leaves office he intends to have so strong a health program under way that it will have to be completed by the next administration.

The Governor also pointed to strides being made in mental health treatment which he said has been woefully lacking in the state.

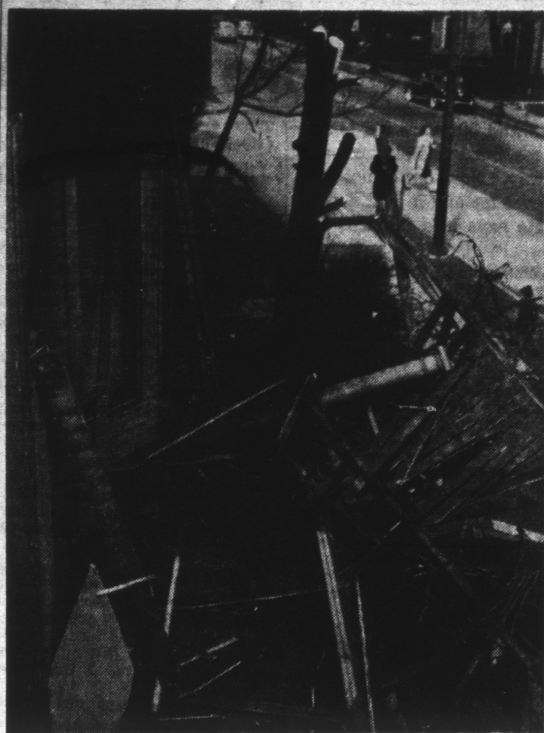
Anton Hulman Jr. of Terre Haute, chairman of the state-wide drive which opens Apr. 1 and runs for a month, said he believed the group could raise the quota, estimated at about \$322,000 (amount raised last year) with \$61,750 for Marion County, and that it might even be exceeded if those who believe in the cause intensely move into the campaign with the same vigor they have shown in their county societies.

Hirohito a Virtual Prisoner, Aides Dictate His Moves

TOKYO, Japan, Mar. 9.—A man's house may be his castle as the saying goes, but in Japan in this occupation year of 1948 it may also be his prison.

Such at least is the situation with respect to Emperor Hirohito and his imperial palace. Hirohito, chief instrument of American occupation policy, is a virtual prisoner today.

Permitted Few Visitors

Hirohito's keepers are top officials of the imperial household ministry, a stubborn island of feudalism in Japan's postwar sea of democracy. His every move is dictated by imperial household functionaries. He is permitted few visitors.

The ill-concealed arrogance of the palace clique is often a source of annoyance to American occupation officials who have been exposed to it.

Hirohito may have renounced divinity, but so far as MacArthur's headquarters is concerned he is still a sacred cow. This is because American policy, from Potsdam to the present, has tacitly upheld the emperor system.

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City Vehicles Use 3576 Less Gallons of Gas

A reduction of 3576 gallons of gasoline used by city vehicles during January and February, compared with the amount used in the same period last year, was announced today by D. G. Watkins, municipal garage superintendent.

The city used 64,965 gallons during the first two months of this year. Last year during January and February a total of 68,541 gallons was used by city-owned vehicles. However, the city is paying 20.3 to 21.8 cents a gallon today, whereas last year at this time it was paying 14 to 15 cents a gallon.
