


Be set by Disasters, W. Morris St. Church Dreams of Constructing New Building

Fire Destroyed First Structure; Storm Razed 2d Meeting Place; Parishioners Carry OnBy EMMA RIVERS MILNER

Fire destroyed the first worship house of the West Morris Street Christian Church. But it rose again from the ruins.

Then along came a storm and blew down the second meeting place. And again the membership rallied.

These events happened a long time ago, but they illustrate how this congregation dreams dreams and then strives to make them come true. It finds steadfast support in the Rev. Harry Bucalstein, the pastor, who was born of Jewish parents in Poland.

As the pastor takes, he makes "feel" the personality of his charge. He describes with a glee in his eye the colorful history—the story of how men of the church built with their own hands a tabernacle of donated lumber after the public halls in which they had worshipped were burned and toppled over by the wind.

"This is a typical American church, a cross section of the city's population with just enough Kentuckians thrown in to give it a southern flavor," he commented. Indiana's late governor, La Chase, now and then preached here.

The quaint, white frame church stands at the corner of Blain Ave. and W. Morris St. next door to the Masonic building. A busy industrial community surrounds it. A ceaseless stream of traffic grinds past its doors which open on the sidewalk.

A giant meeting of 3800 delegates from 18 Protestant denominations is expected to attend a meeting in October in Columbus, O.

Catholics Join With Protestants

The Interdenominational Good Friday Committee including Catholics and Protestants announces a city-wide effort to publicize the meetings.

The downtown Protestant services will be held in the English and Keith's Theaters and the First Baptist Church. The Knights of Columbus will sponsor the Catholic Way of the Cross Devotions in the War Memorial Plaza.

Theater trailers, trolley bumper boats, the tolling of bells, the one minute pause of elevators, buses and streetcars at 2:59, the distribution of store window placards and the flying cross over the city at noon—all are planned to call the city's attention to the Good Friday observance.
