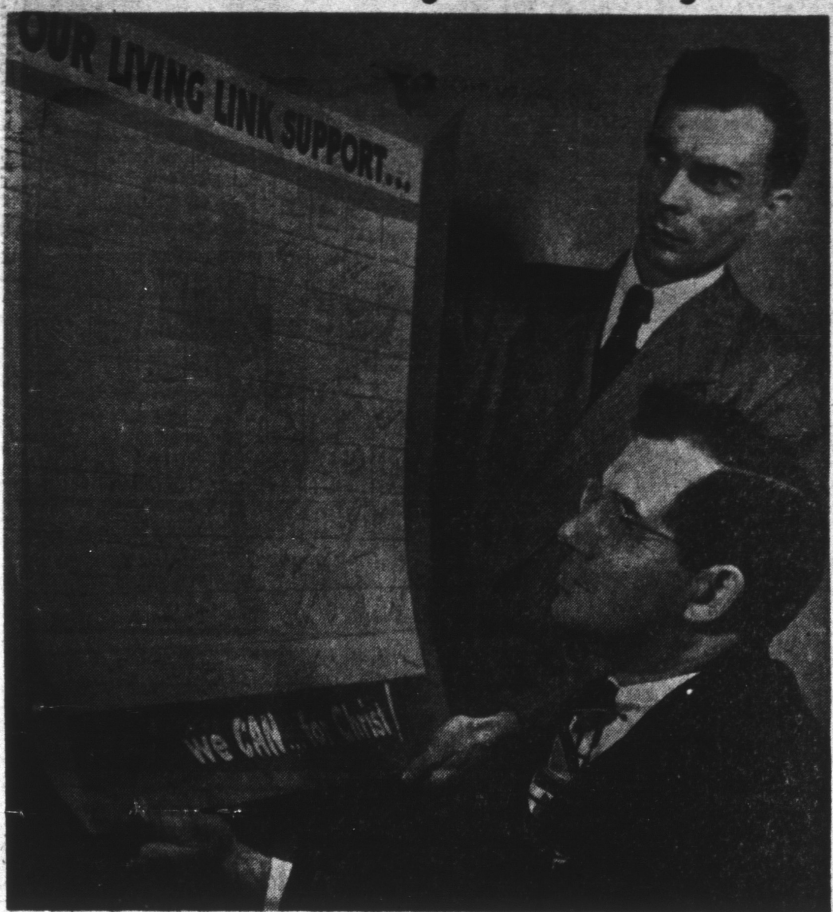


# Beset by Disasters, W. Morris St. Church Dreams of Constructing New Building

## Fire Destroyed First Structure; Storm Razed 2d Meeting Place; Parishioners Carry On

Fire destroyed the first worship house of the West Morris Street Christian Church. But it rose again from the ruins.

Then along came a storm and blew down the second meeting place. And again the membership rallied.

These events happened a long time ago, but they illustrate how this congregation dreams dreams and then strives to make them come true.

It finds steadfast support in the Rev. Harry Bucalstein, the pastor who was born of Jewish parents in Poland.

Gleam in Eye

As the pastor talks, he makes you "feel" the personality of his charge. He describes with a gleam in his eye its colorful history—the story of how men of the church built with their own hands a tabernacle of donated lumber after the public halls in which they had worshipped were burned and toppled over by the wind.

"This is a typical American church, a cross section of the city's population with just enough Kentuckians thrown in to give it a southern flavor," he commented. Indiana's late governor, Ira Chase, now and then preached here.

The quaint, white frame church stands at the corner of Blaine Ave. and W. Morris St. next door to the Masonic building. A busy industrial community surrounds it. A ceaseless stream of traffic grinds past its doors which open on the sidewalk.

Known as Conservatives

The members take the New Testament as their literal guide and consequently are known as conservatives among the Protestant groups, the pastor explained. However, he enjoys telling that his group, in the beginning, withdrew from an ultra-conservative church because it ruled out organ music and the Sunday school.

William Blake is the only one of

the original founders left on the W. Morris St. roll.

The church now is "dreaming" of a new building. For some time, many families have maintained a custom of praying for this daily during grace at the noon meal.

Meanwhile, they consider it their duty to aid with the spread of the Gospel throughout the world. And they are promoting a special campaign to raise funds for the direct support of a foreign missionary.

Makes Chart

James Bradford, John Herron Art School student, made a large chart centered with a cross to hang in the building. He marked it off in 100 squares. Each square is sold for \$12, or a dollar a month for 12 months.

By Easter, it is hoped the congregation can celebrate the sale of the entire 100 which will represent \$1200. The amount will be used to finance a missionary overseas. Mrs. Frank Brouse is missionary treasurer.

The short, well-set Mr. Bucalstein radiates spiritual force. He likes to go fishing but he has little time to spare for it. He reads many books especially those on Jewish subjects. Last month, an article written by him on "Palestine Looms" was published in United Evangelical Action. He is 42 years old and came to America in 1904. He was educated in the University of Baltimore and trained for the ministry at the Northern

Baptist Theological Seminary, Chicago.

He loses no time in telling a new acquaintance of his Jewish background, is teaching his 12-year-old son, Paul, the Hebrew language. The Rev. Mr. Bucalstein served churches in Wisconsin and Minnesota and did special work for the Christian churches in New York before coming here 11 months ago. He is a member of the executive committee of the Hebrew-Christian Alliance which maintains an orphanage for Jewish children in Hungary.

Live in Parsonage

In 1934, the former Miss Lettie Smedley of Minneapolis, who comes of a gentle family, and the Rev. Mr. Bucalstein were married. In addition, Paul, they have a little daughter, Phoebe Ann, 8. The four live in the parsonage adjoining the church.

Worship is held at 9:30 a. m. on Sundays followed by Sunday school in the church. The church school classes also serve as the lay organizations of the congregation and each hold at least one week-day meeting per month.

George Kendall, Butler School of Religion student, directs the music and youth work. Earl Davis is head of the church board and Lester Delks assists the pastor in his work as superintendent of the Sunday school.

Converted to Christianity

They joined the father in Abington, Ill., where he had made a home for them. A few years afterward, the elder Bucalstein died and the family moved to New York City.

After the father's death and when he was 16, Harry Bucalstein was converted to Christianity and baptized in New York. He was educated in the University of Baltimore and trained for the ministry at the Northern
