

# Jacobs And Stark Seek Nomination In Prosecutor Races

## Erbecker May Join Democrat Contest Also

### Hands Resignation To Mayor Feeney

Developments in the May 4 primary elections today centered around three candidates for prosecutor, two Democrats and one Republican.

Prosecutor Judson L. Stark formally announced his candidacy for renomination on the Republican ticket and Andrew Jacobs, attorney here 21 years, came out officially for the Democratic prosecutor nomination.

The third development was William C. Erbecker's resignation as city prosecutor, apparently as a preliminary move to get into the Democratic prosecutor contest against Mr. Jacobs.

### Alignments "Foggy"

In a letter to Mayor Feeney, Mr. Erbecker stated he was resigning, effective next Monday, "because of private affairs and business reasons."

Factional alignments in the Democratic contest were not clear since both Mr. Erbecker and Mr. Jacobs have support in the City Administration and the regular Democratic organization.

Opposition to Mr. Stark may develop in the regular GOP organization before the filing deadline Saturday night.

### "Running on Own"

More opposition to Sheriff Al Magenheimer's drive for GOP renomination came out last night when James Langford, former police department sergeant 20 years, filed his candidacy in the GOP sheriff race.

Mr. Langford, now an assistant manager of the Eastern Loan Co., said he was not aligned with any faction of the GOP organization.

"This is an open primary and I'm running on my own as a Republican," he said.

The only other candidate running against Sheriff Magenheimer is Otto W. Gasper, former chief jailer.

### "On My Record"

Prosecutor Stark in his campaign statement said he was seeking renomination "on my record."

"I promised two years ago to abolish political influence whereby in the past many criminals have been able to flout our laws and escape punishment," Mr. Stark said.

"A new respect for law has been created in Marion County and the administration of justice along political lines has been abolished."

The prosecutor stressed his accomplishments during the year and three months in office, citing speedy trials and convictions of criminals in several major crimes.

### Cites Recent Cases

He indicated he will campaign on his success in the conviction of Robert A. Watts, who was sentenced to death for murder of an Indianapolis woman within 60 days after the killing, and the Howard Pollard murder case, in which a life sentence was obtained this week.

He cited his record, which he said shows that the prosecutor's office has doubled convictions in the last year.

Mr. Jacobs issued a lengthy statement on his platform, listing

your own suckers, then you pay the owner only \$1 a gallon. By the way, most of the gas tanks have locks, so there's no adding gas out of your own pocket.

"Funny thing, the average boot works harder for another guy than he does for himself. When a boot gets a car of his own, he gets to playing the dollies and going on the lush and he don't get nowhere.

"Of course, this phone business ain't cheap; six to eight bucks a day some of these monkeys are asking for phone service alone. But it's better than riding your back stiff looking for fares.

"I like to get on a phone where they ain't more than 10-12 cabs. Sometimes the boot and car owner split the phone costs 50-50. Oh, there are lots of deals for a sharp operator.

Heading Toward Manana  
"A bootie is always heading toward manana, especially if this is Thursday. Because that's when business starts to pick up. And he tries to keep his eye on the main stem and if a guy can't make money there, he better give up.

"But, Monday is a pretty good day, especially from 6 to 10 a. m. if a guy wants to get up that early. Most people have hangovers and they sleep too late to get to work on time any other way.

"We like to work from about 4 p. m. until 2-3:30 a. m. You ask about the angles. One of the big deals, of course, is after-hours whiskey. You get a lot of live guys who want to get a jug after the spots close. Sometimes a white cab will pull up alongside and give you the office. He gives you \$5-\$10. Once in a while a boot just don't get back. That's the chance the other guy has to take. A lot of the white drivers have their own liquor connections with different taverns and package joints.

Got to Know Your Stuff  
"A lot of loaded citizens want a gal. That usually is good for a fin at least. Most boots keep a book with gals' names.

"Now and then a wild guy wants to buy weed or some morphine. Now, you got to know your stuff to get these things.

"Several times I've had guys come to me and ask me to haul hot stuff from one place to another. The chances ain't so big with all the fences operating. Anyway, if you can size up your guys it's always good for a piece of the take.

"Yeah, we get the zooters who want to cook up a smoke party. These guys like to use boots. This way, they can have a boot pick up each pal and the last guy who gets in gives the cabbie the name of the joint where the smokin' is to take place. That way, they don't run no chances. And, they pay off for this service."

## Await Court Test On Bootleg Cabs

Prosecution under an amended ordinance applying to bootleg taxicabs has been held up until a court test can be made of its constitutionality.

A defense attorney for several alleged bootleg cab stand operators challenged the ordinance yesterday in Judge Alex Clark's Municipal Court 4 during a hearing.

The judge took the case under advisement to study the ordinance, which makes it unlawful for anyone to use a telephone to receive or give orders for a bootleg cab, or to dispatch one. In addition, anyone accepting or giving this type of service is subject to arrest.

Defense attorneys claim this is a power broader than the state constitution ever intended a city should have.

Expect Marshall To Blast Reds  
Secretary Marshall will open the conference with a call upon Latin America for whole-hearted support of the United States' "Stop Russia" campaign in Europe and a warning that there can be no compromise with communism.

## ITU Briefs Locals On New Contracts

### Detail Procedure For Compliance

The AFL International Typographical Union sent its locals a set of instructions today on how to negotiate new contracts with newspaper publishers.

The instructions detail correct procedures for "complying fully" with a temporary injunction decree handed down last Saturday. The injunction restrained the ITU, its locals and their members from certain allegedly unfair labor acts.

The ITU included the instructions in a 2000-word bulletin to local unions. The bulletin was drawn up in Washington by ITU attorneys in line with the international's agreement to abandon its "no contract" policy in dealings with newspapers.

The local unions have been instructed to invite publishers into negotiations aimed at ending all disputes, including strikes against 16 newspapers in nine cities.

U. S. Marines Held By Chinese Reds Freed  
TSINGTAO, China, Apr. 1 (UP)—Four U. S. Marines taken prisoner by Chinese Communists while on a hunting trip last Christmas Day have been set free and returned safely to U. S. authorities at Haiyang, it was announced today.

Five Marines went on the hunting trip but one was reported killed by the Communists when the group was taken prisoner.
