

Wallace May Not Get Armory Here

Hint Order to Shut Down Rally

Henry A. Wallace may have to hire another hall for an Apr. 7 rally here in his third-party presidential campaign, not the Armory where he first planned to speak.

Brig. Gen. Howard Maxwell, Indiana Adjutant General in charge of the Armory, told the committee yesterday that the state had rented the Armory to the committee for a speech by Mr. Wallace.

But, said Mrs. Jessica Rhine, executive secretary of the committee, Gen. Maxwell added that he might be ordered to "shut down the rally" unless "certain individuals are withdrawn from the program."

Mrs. Rhine said Gen. Maxwell suggested that the committee cancel the appearance of singer Paul Robeson, who was scheduled to share the speaker's platform with Mr. Wallace.

Mr. Robeson, who is head of the vocal education department of Crispus Attucks High School, will be presented the award by the Rev. Clinton M. Morris in recognition of his service to the Negro race.

Mrs. Mattie James will preside at tomorrow's program. Starling Jones, president of the association, will also speak.

The George W. Cable Award is given by Dr. Theodore Cable in honor of his father, and this year will mark the 10th annual presentation of the medal.

Grammar school pupils scheduled to compete in The Times Spelling Bee Monday night at three centers should bring their official entry blanks to those centers if they have not mailed them.

Other contests Friday

Contests for other schools at other centers will be held each night through Friday next week. The balance of the schedule will appear in Monday's Times.

The public will be admitted to the contests and there will be no admission charges.

Here are the rules:

The contest is open to all grammar school pupils not beyond the eighth grade and who will not be 16 years old before June 1.

Contestants may pronounce words before, or after spelling them, or not at all. Spellers failing to spell a word correctly must drop out of the contest and a new word will be given to the next contestant.

A contestant will not be allowed to change a letter once pronounced. A speller, having started to spell a word, may retract, providing letters and their sequence are not changed in retracting.

Obsolete spellings will be regarded as errors.

Spellers need not indicate capital letters or punctuation marks.

A contestant may request that a word be re-pronounced or defined or used in a sentence.

The decision of the judges is final.
