Mr. Black is a senior majoring in music and art. He is a member of the Music Club and Les Eleves.

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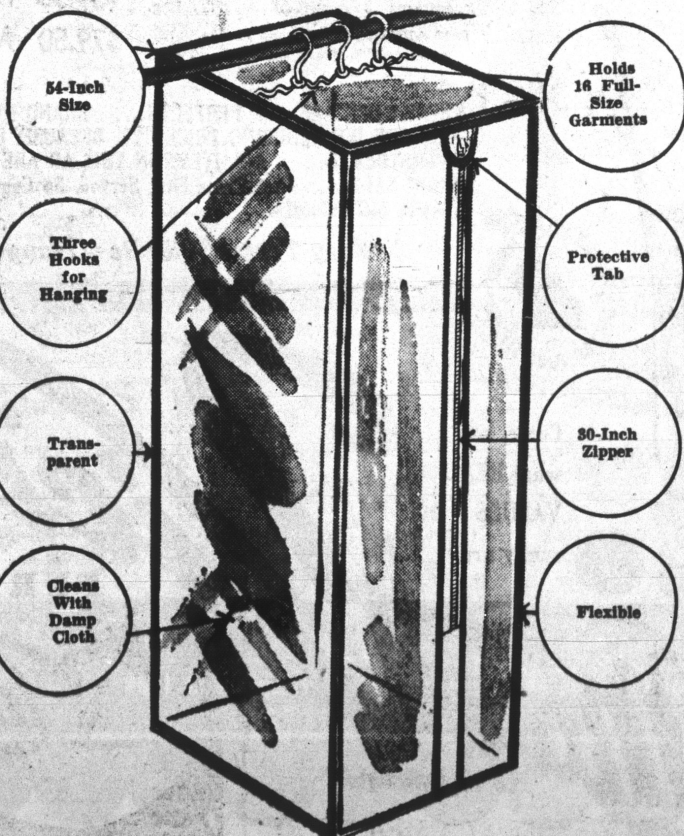
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
