

2 Return To Bowl

Veteran Artists Get Big Roles

Two veterans of last summer's Butler Bowl season will return for important roles in the coming season's operettas, according to Alonzo Price, production director.

The returning artists are: Phyllis Wilcox, Indianapolis soprano, and Dennis Carroll, tenor, who appeared in last season's productions of "The New Moon" and "Naughty Marietta."

A newcomer to the "Stars Under the Stars" series will be Harold Patrick, baritone, Mr. Price revealed today. All three soloists so far announced will appear in the coming season's three operettas: "The Desert Song," July 24-26; "The Merry Widow," July 24-26, and "The Vagabond King," Aug. 15-21.

Preparations to Start

Preparations for the summer season will start with auditions for membership in the permanent chorus, which are scheduled for 7:30 p. m. next Saturday in the Wilking Music Co., 120 N. Pennsylvania St.

Charles Hedley, music director and conductor for the operettas, will select a chorus of 22 men and 18 women, who will be given employment on a weekly salary basis beginning about June 5 and closing with the presentation of the last operetta.

The chief requirement for the auditions is that women applicants must be in the 16- to 30-year age group, men in the 18- to 35-year group, Mr. Hedley has announced.

Extend Confidence Vote To Dr. Edward Condon

NEW YORK, Apr. 13 (UP)—The Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists gave a vote-of-confidence dinner last night for Dr. Edward U. Condon, chief of the United States Bureau of Standards.

The testimonial dinner was attended by nine Nobel Prize winners, to other members of the American Academy of Sciences and 57 other leading U. S. scientists.

Dr. Condon recently was attacked by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, which questioned his loyalty.

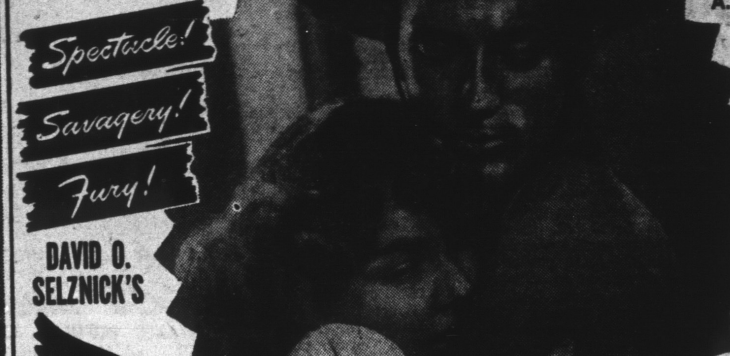
