## Regular GOP Forces Adopt New Name

Lineup With Group Headed by H. C. Wolff

The regular Republican organization forces here will line up for the May 4 primary battles under the name of the Republican Candidates Committee, it was learned today.

Party leaders associated with Chairman James Ingles will not campaign as the Ingles group since the chairman has withdrawn his office from all factional conflicts for an "unbiased, open" primary.

Instead, the so-called GOP regulars will work through the candidates committee to be headed by Herman C. Wolff, insurance firm executive and once the party's nominee for mayor.

Mrs. John Paul Ragsdale, 50 N. Bolton Ave., has been named vice chairman of the committee; Gerald C. Purdy, secretary and Preston Scott, treasurer.

The committee's campaign headquarters were opened today in Room 420, Ober Building, 33 N. Pennsylvania St.

Mr. Wolff said the committee was formed to "promote the best interests of the Republican Party in the primary campaign."

The group will support a list of candidates in the primary balloting. This list is expected to be made known a few days before the election.

Rival GOP forces that have been rallying around James L. Bradford, former county party chairman and supporter of U. S. Sen. William E. Jenner, have formed another group to back their own slate of candidates.

This group will be known as the Marion County Republican Campaign Committee.

Why Not Try This?

In China, most parents think it quite improper to praise their own children. They feel that it is immodest and unfitting. A good many American parents seem to have something of the same attitude. They are ready to scold youngsters for doing something wrong but feel that they should be expected to do the right things without comment or praise.

There is little doubt that praise can be overdone. A child should not learn to expect words of commendation for every little thing he does. On the other hand, widely used praise is a very fine thing for it encourages the child to try even harder to do the things he needs to learn to do. It makes him feel his parents are friendly and understanding, too.

Why not carry on an experiment in your own family? For just a week watch the scolding-tone it down or drop it. Instead, look for things that you can conscientiously praise. They're to be found in every child if only we're on the lookout. At the end of the week, check and see whether the youngsters haven't responded well and whether you don't feel pretty good about the whole thing. It's worth a try.

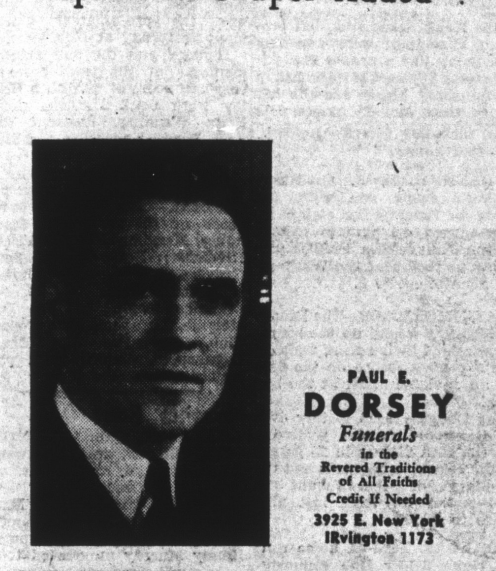
