Sarah Carr, Indianapolis; a son,

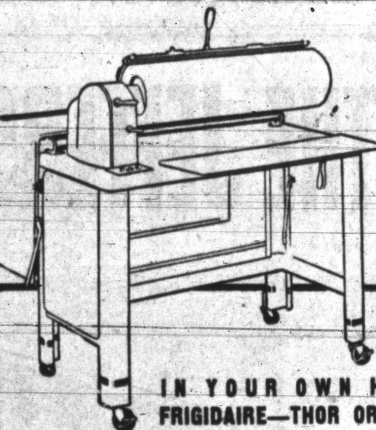

The body of William Korbelik, 42, missing since Jan. 10, was found by his wife and daughter.

Coroner Samuel Lewis said there was a bullet in the victim's head.

Police believed he had been slain elsewhere, and that his body had been dragged into the basement and hidden beneath the lumber pile.
