

Horse Show Entries Reach All-Time High Today

Expect More Than 300 Animals to Compete;
Entries Come in From Five States

The entry list for the Legion-Times Charity Horse Show at the Coliseum May 14, 15 and 16, stood at an all-time peak today with prospects that entries still in the mail would boost the total to more than 300 of the Midwest's finest show horses.

A count from horse show headquarters late yesterday afternoon revealed 280 entries already in, with letters and telegrams from Times when the entry staff completes its tabulation.

Keepers were given the names of entries ticket sales—both mail order and over-the-counter—were heavy. With the show less than two weeks away there are still good reserved and box seats available, officials reported. But they advised against waiting until the last minute to try to buy "down-front" seats.

Box or reserved seats are on sale at a special booth in the lobby of the Indianapolis Power and Light Co., on the Circle. The box office is open daily from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. except Sunday.

Mail order ticket requests still are being accepted. Applications for tickets should be sent to Legion-Times Horse Show, Room 833, Lemcke Bldg., Indianapolis.

Ticket prices are \$1.20 for box seats, and 85 cents for side mezzanine seats. General admission tickets for the end mezzanine section of the Coliseum at 50 cents will go on sale soon.

10,000 Scouts to Present Circus Friday, Saturday

Indianapolis will see the reverse of juvenile delinquency when approximately 10,000 upstanding young Americans present their 1948 Scout Circus Friday and Saturday.

The show of eight major events will be given in the Indiana Fairgrounds Coliseum. All will depict pioneer or Indian life with the boys dressed either in the costumes of the early settlers or Indians.

Carl Parlasca, a nationally known authority on Indian lore and Scout executive of Elgin, Ill., arrived today to help local Scouts with circus preparations. Mr. Parlasca will direct the Indian pageant with which the circus opens.

10,000 to March

This will be followed by the grand entry of nearly 10,000 Scouts preceded by a 50-piece band and bearers of 400 American flags. It requires 20 minutes for the boys to march into the arena but by some trick of magic they clear the floor very rapidly for the cubbing event which comes next.

A contingent of 2000 cubs, ranging from 9 through 11 years of age, will set up tepees, dance war dances, draw covered wagons disguised as mules or oxen and perform other activities.
