

## Fire 3d Attendant, Close Epileptics' Whipping Probe

**Superintendent Pledges Continued Check  
On Possible Cruelty at Village**

NEW CASTLE, May 20—Investigation of rubber hose whippings at the Indiana Village for Epileptics was "closed" today after a third employee was fired for participation in the beatings.

But even though we've finished our investigation of this incident," Dr. W. C. Van Nys, village superintendent, said, "we never really stop checking on the possibility that patients might be abused. Beating of patients is something we cannot tolerate under any circumstances."

Albert C. Howell, 67, of Louisville, Ky., was dismissed as a village attendant late yesterday in connection with two hose beatings of 17-year-old Jackie White of Indianapolis.

**Fired Two Tuesday**

Two other attendants were fired Tuesday, one for another whipping given the Indianapolis youth and the other for another incident in which an elderly patient was struck.

Dr. Van Nys emphasized that while beatings cannot and will not be tolerated by institution authorities, there were two sides to the story. He described Jackie White as a "problem patient" who had caused trouble for the institution's attendants on more than one occasion.

**Denies Caches**

He pointed out that many of his attendants are elderly men and women and that patients who are difficult and in a few cases violent are sometimes a danger to the deniers.

He denied reports circulated yesterday that sections of rubber hose had been cached at various places in the institution. One length of rubber hose was found

during the course of the investigation, he said.

Dr. Van Nys said the building involved in this case, which houses about 40 patients, was a principal trouble spot through the years and said almost no trouble with inmates or employees had been experienced in the other 34 buildings housing patients in the village's 42-year history. Most of the "difficult" patients are housed in the one structure.


