Mormons of the community next week will sponsor an open meeting to inform interested persons of all faiths and walk of life regarding the beliefs and practices of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

The meeting will be held Friday at 8 p. m. in the World War Memorial building. Two young missionaries from the Far West are arranging the details of the program on which celebrities of the denomination will be heard.

The planning missionaries are Gilbert O. Farnsworth of Salt Lake City and Grant W. Walker, San Francisco.

Like all the other hundreds of young Mormon missionaries serving in all parts of the world, these two receive no salary from the church.

Speakers Scheduled

George J. Price of Salt Lake City, now stationed in Chicago, a longtime official and lecturer of the church, will give the principal address speaking on "The Philosophy of Mormonism in relation to the Sectarian Church Today." Walter L. Jones of Columbus, Ind., will discuss "The Book of Mormon." And Gerald Dale, native of England and convert to the denomination, now chief counselor to the president of the Central Indiana district, will speak on "The Vision of the Church."

Kenneth H. Beasley of Salt Lake City, at present doing the work of a missionary in Muncie, Ind., as president of the Muncie church, will direct the popular meeting Friday night.

Rev. MacLaury Plans Sermon At All Saints Cathedral

The Rev. Douglas R. MacLaury, who will serve as the acting president of Canterbury College next semester, will preach at the liturgical service of evensong tomorrow at 7:30 p. m. in All Saints Episcopal Cathedral.

The Young People's Fellowship of the cathedral, evensong sponsors, have invited youth groups from neighboring Episcopal dioceses in Indiana, Illinois and Kentucky to attend.

The program is an act of worship to Almighty God for His blessing on Canterbury College and an act of consecration for the future work of the school was the explanation given by Phillip Smith, general chairman of arrangements. The special service is being conducted with the approval of the Rt. Rev. R. A. Kirchhofer, bishop of the diocese of Indianapolis.

Word had been received that the superior of the Order of St. Helena is sending a delegation of Episcopalians from the order's convent in Versailles, Ky., to be present for tomorrow's festivities. The teaching order interests itself in the religious activities of young people.

The Rev. William E. Weidon will officiate at evensong and direct the hymn sing preceding it at 7 p. m. The social hour following evensong will be directed by Mrs. Harry C. Lee. Mrs. Dorothy Davis will play the organ for the services. Acolytes, servers, the choir, and local and visiting ministers will march in the procession.

Young people assisting Mr. Smith with arrangements include Ralph Smith, Orval Fletcher, James G. Jones Jr., James O. Mote, Mary Lockwood and Helen Knox, all of Indianapolis; Henry Johnson, Chicago, and students of Canterbury College.

The college is the only co-educational liberal arts school of the Episcopal Church and is under the direction of lay and clerical trustees from the dioceses of Indianapolis and Northern Indiana. The Rt. Rev. Reginald Mallett, bishop of Northern Indiana, is president of the college board.

Church to Mark 52d Anniversary

The Union Congregational Church, which is having a most unusual increase both in membership and attendance, will mark its 52d anniversary with an all-day celebration tomorrow. The Rev. Gerard B. Blue is the pastor.

Since the beginning of the year last October, the church membership has increased over 40 per cent. The Rev. Blue

will be the celebrant for his silver jubilee solemn high mass tomorrow at 11 a. m. in the Holy Angels Catholic Church.

The Most Rev. Paul C. Schulte, archbishop of Indianapolis, will be present in the sanctuary. The Rev. Henry Verst of Madison, Ind., will preach the sermon. Assistant priests include the Rev. Fr. Preceding the mass, a procession will form in the rectory and march into the church in honor of that 25th anniversary of Father Trapp's ordination to the priesthood. Cross bearers and a color guard of Boy Scouts belonging to the Holy Angels Trapp 74 will lead the procession. Following them will be this year's class who will receive the Holy Communion for the first time tomorrow.

Banquet Planned

A banquet for the visiting clergy and the archbishop will be given after the mass in the school. From 7 to 9 p. m. Father Knapp will receive his friends and parishioners also in the school. During the reception, men of the Holy Name Society and women of the Altar Society will furnish entertainment beginning at 8 p. m.

Father Trapp was born 55 years ago in Vanduzer County, Ind. He entered St. Meinrad's Seminary in 1918 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1923. He has served his entire priestly career in the state. He came from St. Vincent's Catholic Church in Shelby County, mother church of the archdiocese, to Holy Angels Church seven years ago.
