Mormons Set Open Meeting

Plan Session To Explain Beliefs

Mormons of the community next week will sponsor an open meeting to inform interested persons of all faiths and walks of life regarding the beliefs and practices of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

The meeting will be held Friday at 8 p. m. in the World War Memorial building. Two young missionaries from the Far West are arranging the details of the program on which celebrities of the denomination will be heard. The planning missionaries are Gilbert O. Farnsworth of Salt Lake City and Grant W. Walker, San Francisco.

Like all the other hundreds of young Mormon missionaries serving in all parts of the world, these two receive no salary from the church.

Rev. MacLaury Plans Sermon At All Saints Cathedral

The Rev. Douglas R. MacLaury, who will serve as the acting president of Canterbury College next semester, will preach at the liturgical service of evensong tomorrow at 7:30 p. m. in All Saints Episcopal Cathedral.

The Young People's Fellowship of the cathedral, evensong sponsors, have invited youth groups from neighboring Episcopal dioceses in Indiana, Illinois and Kentucky to attend.

"The program is an act of worship to Almighty God for His blessing on Canterbury College and an act of intercession for the future work of the school," the explanation given by Phillip Smith, general chairman of arrangements. The special service is being conducted with the approval of the Rt. Rev. R. A. Kirchhoffer, bishop of the diocese of Indianapolis.

Word has been received that the superior of the Order of St. Helena is sending a delegation of Episcopal nuns from the order's convent in Versailles, Ky., to be present for tomorrow's festivities. The teaching order interests itself in the religious activities of young people.

The Rev. William E. Weiden will officiate at evensong and direct the hymn singing preceding it at 7 p. m. The social hour following evensong will be directed by Mrs. Harry C. Lee, Mrs. Doris Davis will play the organ for the services. Also present will be the choir, and local and visiting ministers will march in the procession.

Hoosier Group to Attend Presbyterian Assembly

Hoosier delegates among 1000 from all parts of the United States will attend the 160th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A. Tuesday through June 2 in Seattle.

Noteworthy events will include a report by Dr. Jean S. Milner, pastor of the Second Presbyterian Church and president of the Board of National Missions.

It is predicted also that some action will be taken concerning the Rev. Stewart P. MacLennan, retired pastor of the Hollywood Presbyterian Church, who performed the marriage ceremony for movie actress Lana Turner and Henry J. (Bob) Topping. It was the fourth marriage for each of the principals.

A new moderator will be elected to succeed Wilbur LaRoe Jr., a layman who will give the retiring moderator's address. A choir of 35 Indian boys and girls from the Sheldon Jackson Junior College will sing.

The college in Sitka, Alaska, belongs to the denomination.

Dr. Milner's report will tell of the \$6,520,000 of the \$27 million Restoration Fund going into mission work among the Spanish-speaking people and the hospitalization of veterans, and budgets of 41 Presbyterian Colleges in 27 states.

Also the ways in which Restoration Fund gifts are being used both in Europe and Asia will be outlined at the assembly.

New Life Movement

Great stress is to be laid upon the Presbyterian New Life Movement. This is an evangelistic program of the church designed to revive the spirituality of present church members as well as to bring new enrollees into the congregations.

Findings of a study of racial and cultural relations are scheduled for presentation. It seeks to express in action the pronouncements of preceding assemblies against racial discrimination. The Sunday afternoon speakers on "Leadership of Church in Race Relations" will include Henry R. Luce, editor-in-chief of Time, Inc.

A completed plan of reunion between the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A. and the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. will be placed before the Seattle assembly and the one of the southern church meeting simultaneously in Atlanta, Ga.

Both general assemblies are expected to vote on the plan of reunion and authorize that it be submitted to the presbyteries of both denominations in 1949.

Candidates for Office

The re-election of the stated clerk, Dr. William Barrow Pugh of Wallingford, Pa., is due to come before the general assembly. The candidates for the office of moderator are: Dr. Jesse H. Baird, San Anselmo, Cal.; Dr. Clifford E. Barbour, Knoxville, Tenn.; Dr. George E. Barnes, Philadelphia; and Dr. Arnold H. Lowe, Minneapolis.

Delegates going from the Indianapolis Presbytery are: Charles A. Fay and Lewis B. Sebastian, Indianapolis; the Rev. Victor L. Raphael, Spencer; and the Rev. Joseph D. MacDonald, Martinsville. Seven other presbyteries in the state will be represented.

The Presbyterian General Assembly is a delegated working body and not the type of convention to whose sessions many visitors come. However, big popular meetings are held at night when speakers of note are presented. Residents of the community to which the assembly is held are invited to these sessions.

Dr. Bennet to Give Youth Addresses

Dr. Vincent Bennet will give the addresses for the Youth for Christ City-Wide Awakening Campaign tomorrow at 3 and 9 p. m. and daily thereafter, at 9:30 p. m. until June 6.

The campaign meetings are being held in the newly acquired club-house, 20th and Meridian Sts. Dr. Bennet will give his final talk of his series to-night at the 7:30 p. m. Y. for C. Clubhouse.

The Eureka Jubilee Singers will continue their vocal programs of Negro spirituals and other sacred numbers throughout the campaign.

Dr. Bennet is a native of Britain and onetime assistant to the president of Wheaton College. He now devotes his time to evangelistic and Bible conference work.
