300 Hoosiers To Attend Baptist Parley

Milwaukee Meeting To Open Monday
Dr. J. M. Horton, executive secretary of the Indiana Baptist Convention, will head a delegation of approximately 300 persons from the state to the Northern Baptist Convention.

The convention will meet Monday through May 30 in Milwaukee.

Of the Hoosiers attending, about 60 will be from Indianapolis. Ranking official among these will be Dr. Clive McGuire, executive secretary of the Indianapolis Baptist Association.

Dr. Gaines M. Cook of Indianapolis, executive secretary of the Disciples of Christ International Convention, is listed as one of the principal speakers. He will give an address on the "We Work With Others" program Friday morning.

Announce Theme
Baptists have chosen as the theme for this 40th annual meeting, "... And I Work," taken from John 5:17. The divisions of the theme indicate the diversified, world-wide effort of the denomination. They are: "We work in evangelism; in America; in other lands; with others; and in education."

A joint committee of Baptists and Disciples has been at work on the problem of the union of the two denominations. It is expected that the committee will report at the convention.

However, since there is no central government in the Baptist Church and each congregation is autonomous, a legal merger must be preceded by favorable action on the part of the separate congregations, Dr. Horton pointed out.

Milwaukee Speaker
Dr. McGuire will speak at a preliminary conference of Baptist city executives this afternoon in Milwaukee. His topic is "Denominational Policies in Times of Controversy."

Dr. Horton also is in Milwaukee today to attend sessions preceding the opening of the convention proper.

Dr. Herbert F. Thurston is a member of the board of education and publication and Dr. C. W. Atwater, pastor of the First Baptist Church, is a member of the Ministers' and Missionaries' Benefit Board. Mrs. L. C. Trent serves on the official board of the American Baptist Home Mission Society. The Rev. Floyd F. Smith holds the office of secretary for the Ministerial Council of the convention.

Tour Planned
An educational trip to Green Lake, Wis., for the inspection of the 1100-acre assembly ground of the Northern Baptist Convention will be conducted by the Rev. William O. Breedlove.

Among the other local persons going to the convention are the Rev. Donald J. Dunkin, moderator of the Indianapolis Association; the Rev. Carl Moman, Dr. U. S. Clutton, the Rev. Gordon Paschall, the Rev. George G. Kimsey, the Rev. Walter Laetsch, the Rev. Peter Vroom and the Rev. Ruben H. Lindstrom. (E. R. M.)

Grandpa's Daily Bread

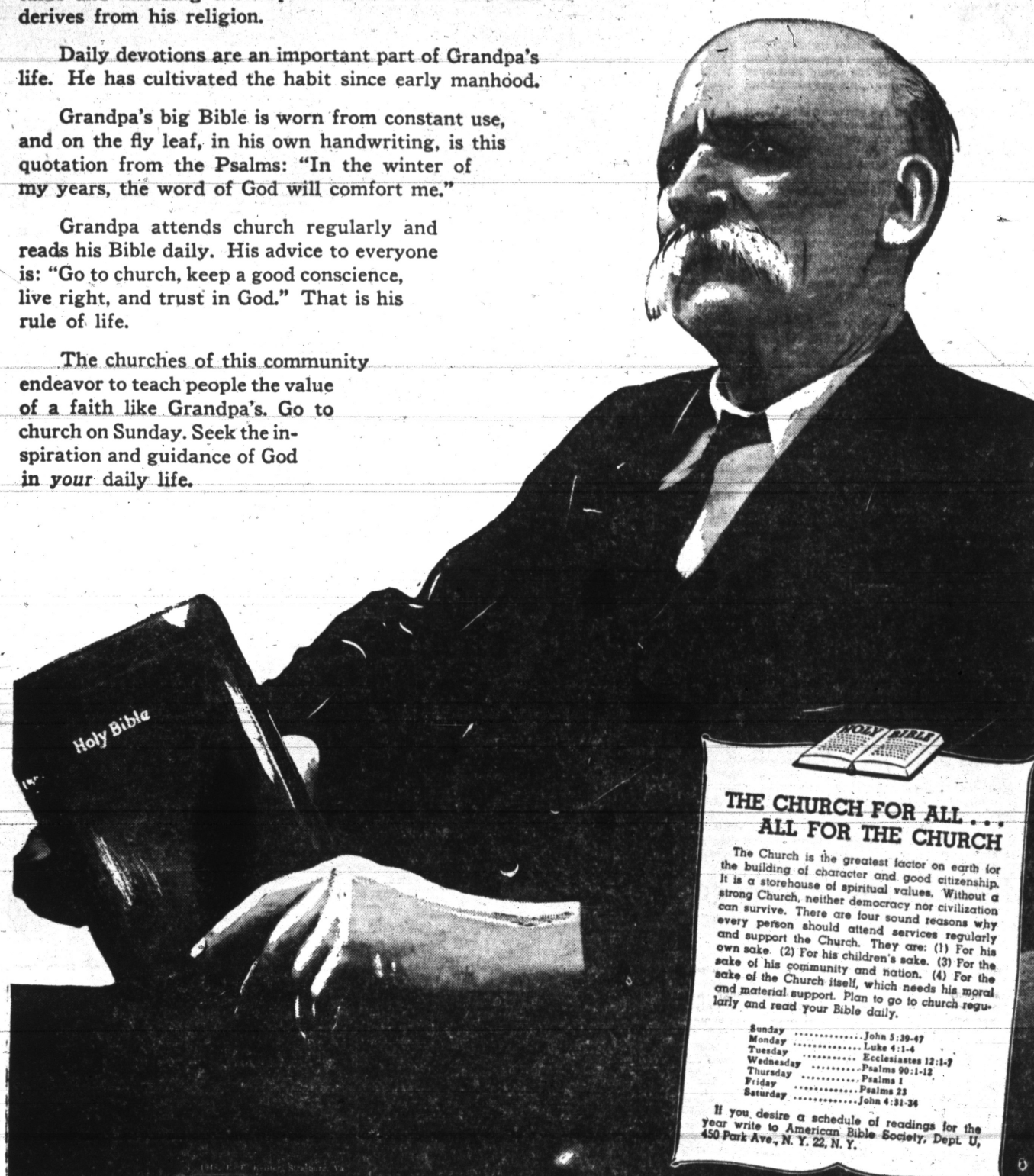
