Convicted in Gary Swamp Slaying

VALPARAISO, May 28 (UP)—Joseph Muscarello, 35, of Chicago, today began a two-to-21-year prison sentence for manslaughter.

He was charged with the slaying of Mrs. Irene Shawky, Chicago, whose body was found in a swamp near Gary, Jan. 26, 1947.

The Porter County Circuit Court jury returned its verdict early today and he was sentenced to the Michigan City prison. Conviction made the sentence mandatory.

The victim was last seen the day before her death when the prosecution said, she went to Muscarello's home to borrow his automobile.

Serious Damage Caused As Quake Rocks Lima

LIMA, May 28 (UP)—Serious damage and some casualties were caused by a strong earthquake that hit the west coast of Peru early this morning, it was reported today.

Canete, 40 miles south of Lima, was reported the hardest hit, with almost every house in town damaged. Reports said "many" persons were injured, and that the population fled their homes in panic.

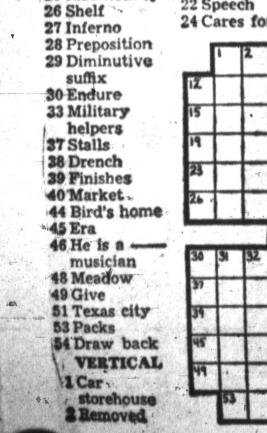
A light quake felt at 4 p. m. yesterday caused no damage or casualties.

Boy, 14, Tells of Smothering Girl to Death Over Comics

Reveals Quarrel About Unreturned Books; Spent Night Riding Around Chicago

CHICAGO, May 28 (UP)—Roy Adams, 14, confessed today that he smothered an 8-year-old neighbor girl who was found dying in his bed with a stalk of rhubarb clutched in her hand.

He said he piled pillows over Nancy Schuler's head yesterday in a fit of rage when they quarreled about comic books.

He denied that he had enticed her into his bed with the rhubarb, her favorite food.

Police captured him about 5 a. m., Indianapolis time, today as he rode a Howard St. elevated train. He did not know that the girl was dead when he confessed that he had pressed the pillows onto her head "for about five minutes."

Police Sought Boy
Police had sought the boy since Nancy was discovered yesterday afternoon.

A passenger, Mrs. Ellen Zack, noticed the boy on the train and notified authorities. They met the train at the end of its run and took him into custody.

He said that during his night of riding the "El" he saw headlines that an 8-year-old girl had been killed but "I didn't think they meant Nancy."

He said the girl, who lived in the same building as his family, came to his parents' apartment yesterday to borrow some comic books.

Indict 3 Charged With Murder

The Grand Jury returned first degree murder indictments against three defendants in Criminal Court today.

Lionel Odom, 34, of 814 S. Kenwood Ave., was charged with murder in connection with the fatal shooting last May 2 of Rufus Beaman, 29, during a drinking party at the Kenwood Ave. address.

The jury indicted D. L. Morris, 32, of 639 1/2 W. North St., on a first degree murder charge in connection with the fatal clubbing of Curtis Richardson, 43, of 134 S. West St., in a street fight last Mar. 8.

The name of a third defendant indicted for murder was withheld pending his arrest.

Manuscript Charge
Frank E. Hathaway, of 2039 Talbot Ave., was charged with manslaughter in the death of George Bunea, 65, of 519 W. Pearl St., who was fatally injured in a street fight here several weeks ago.

The jury ruled that the fatal shooting of Russell Schunabel, 40, of 565 Highland Ave., last April by his son, William R. Schunabel, 20, was "justifiable homicide" and returned a "no bill."

Young Schunabel said he shot his father to protect the life of his mother, Mrs. Stella Schunabel, who was being beaten when the fatal shot was fired.
