Judge Eichhorn Dies at Bluffton

Prosecuted Newberry Election Fraud Case

BLUFFTON, May 28—William
Henry Eichhorn, judge of the
Wells County Circuit Court for
many years and former member
of the Indiana Legislature, died
at his home here yesterday. He
was 81.

Judge Eichhorn attracted na-
tionalwide attention more than 20
years ago when he was special
prosecutor in the famous Mich-
igan election fraud case involving
Sen. Truman H. Newberry.

He served several terms as
Circuit Court judge here, the first
one beginning in 1912. He was re-
elected to the bench for another
six-year term in 1942.

Served in House
He was a member of the House of
Representatives before the
turn of the century and served as
a trustee of the Indiana Re-
formatory and was a member of
the State Board of Charities for
13 years.

More recently, Judge Eichhorn
served on Gov. Gates' commission
for recodification of the state's
criminal laws.

He is survived by two sons, Frederic
Eichhorn, Gary attorney, former state
Senator and chairman of the Public Service
Commission, and Joseph Eich-
horn, present Wells County pro-
secutor; a sister, Mrs. Emma Kath-
erine Eich, Maricle.

Funeral services will be held
here at 2 p.m. tomorrow. Burial will be in
Fairview Cemetery.

Draft Hits New Delays in Both House, Senate

WASHINGTON, May 28 (UPI)—
The draft ran into new delays
today in both House and Senate.
The House Rules Committee,
overriding a protest by Dem-
ocratic members, called a third
week of hearings. And the Senate
put off debate on the draft until
late next week.

American Legion Commander
James F. O'Neil said Congress
has been "inexcusably negligent"
in this and other defense legisla-
tion. He said Rules Committee
Chairman Leo E. Allen (R. Ill.)
is staging a "back-stage filibuster"
against selective service.


