A used-car salesman from Celina, Ohio, said he was robbed of \$300 cash and \$950 in checks in the 900 block, N. Illinois St., last night.

The victim, Rudy Buschor, 36, said he brought four cars to Indianapolis yesterday and sold them at an auction at the Shafer Auto Sales lot, 915 N. Illinois St. He told detectives that he went to a nearby tavern at 11th and Illinois Sts. and began drinking and talking with a youth at the bar.

Mr. Buschor said he and the youth went for a walk to "get some air" and while they were at the rear of the Shafer car lot, the youth suddenly attacked him, pinning his arms behind him. "He took my billfold and ran," Mr. Buschor said.

The billfold contained \$950 in checks he said he received for the cars and \$300 cash.
