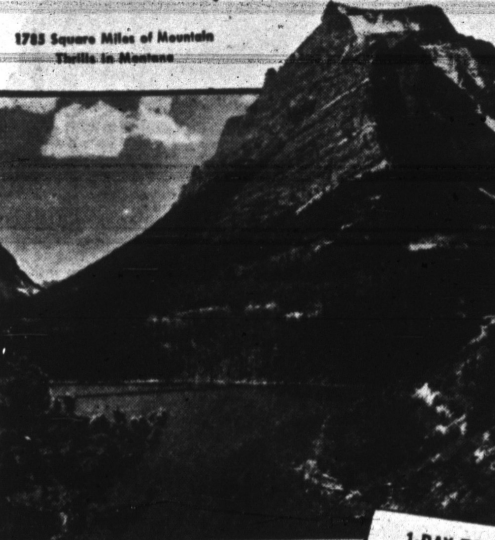

Long Fight for Dirigibles Heads Toward Showdown

Maritime Commission to Study Feasibility Of Lighter-Than-Air Passenger Craft

WASHINGTON, June 15—It looks as if the large passenger-carrying dirigible, buffeted about by controversy these many years, may have another chance.

Two men have been shouting the praises of lighter-than-air craft with an enthusiasm that is uncommon even in the aviation field. Congress has listened and appears ready to turn the business over to the Maritime Commission.

The men are Paul W. Litchfield, board chairman of Good-year Tire & Rubber Co., and Vice Adm. C. E. Rosendahl, who has berated the Navy, since his retirement, for what he considers an indifferent attitude toward development of airships.

These men and their few supporters envision rigid airships half again the size of the German Hindenburg, flying the oceans at speeds midway between those of steamships and airplanes, furnishing their patrons with luxurious lounges, dining salons and staterooms at prices below those of airlines.

Made Little Progress
Until this week they hadn't got far.

Now the Senate and House have passed bills with some differences to be ironed out in conference committee, directing the Maritime Commission to study the feasibility of a government-supported program for development of passenger-carrying airships.

Mr. Rosendahl has not by any means won his point that the dirigible should be developed as a new form of transportation with vast possibilities. And the

Urge Congress Probe Effect Of Tobacco on Morals

WASHINGTON, June 15 (UP)—It might be just as well, Rep. Walter K. Granger (D. Utah) said today, if the South never grew another leaf of tobacco.

Mr. Granger, a member of the House Agriculture Committee, stressed that there's no malice behind his suggestion.

He is just tired, he said in an interview, of the tobacco firms and the people who push their wares.

Mr. Granger said that's why he has introduced a bill to investigate the "entire tobacco and cigarette problem."

Mr. Granger, a Mormon whose religion frowns on the use of tobacco, said he has resented for some time "the attitude of tobacco companies who push their way into your home on the radio."

The idea, he said, is for Congress to make a "strictly scientific" investigation of the impact of tobacco on the morals, efficiency and mental outlook of people who use cigarettes and cigars.

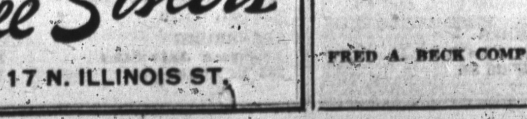

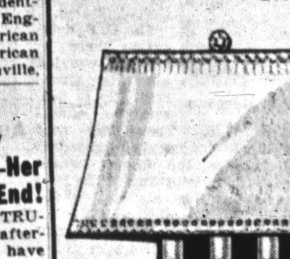
