

# Truman Contends His Jibes Set Bonfire Under Congress

## Nears Home Territory In Missouri

### Plans 48-State Campaign Tour

**ABOARD TRUMAN TRAIN**  
June 16 (UP)—President Truman said today that the "brick-bats" he has been tossing at Congress are forcing the legislators to take action on bills he considers vital.

Heading into his home territory of Kansas and Missouri, the President told listeners that two weeks of "pouring it on" Congress was beginning to pay off.

"I've been pouring it on them and they have got the jitters back there," he told a crowd in Albuquerque, N. M., late yesterday. "They have gone to work."

As he neared his native Missouri on the trip back to Washington, the President was mapping high strategy for the November presidential campaign, confident that he will win the Democratic nomination.

It was learned that he plans a high-powered, 48-state campaign tour as soon as the nomination is safely in his hands.

The President will make no major speeches as he moves on this trip through Kansas and Missouri, but he will be in Kansas City and Independence, his home town, and leave tomorrow for Washington by way of St. Louis. He arrives at the capital Friday.

### Pepsi-Cola Plans 'Speedy Drink'

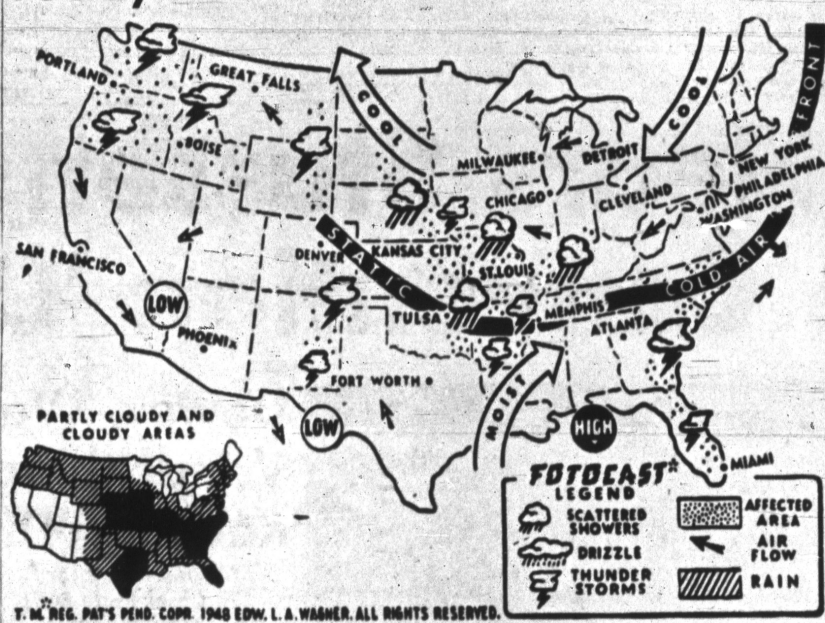
Pepsi-Cola, one of the longest of soft drinks, soon will be a faster one, too.
