Expects Continued Rice Shortage

U. S. Expert Finds Problem Acute

TOKYO, Japan, June 18 — Although the overall picture looks a bit brighter this year than last the serious world rice shortage may be expected to continue for several more years.

This is the melancholy conclusion of international rice specialist John N. Efferson of the United States Agriculture Department, who arrived here recently after a study of rice production in the Philippines, Southeast Asia and China.

Mr. Efferson says that three important exporting countries—Burma, Siam and French Indo-China—report slight increases in rice exports. However, he adds, even if these countries reach their most optimistic goals, 1948 exports still will be only half as great as they were in prewar years.

Burma, for example, used to export nearly 3 million tons annually. This year it will export only 1.5 million.

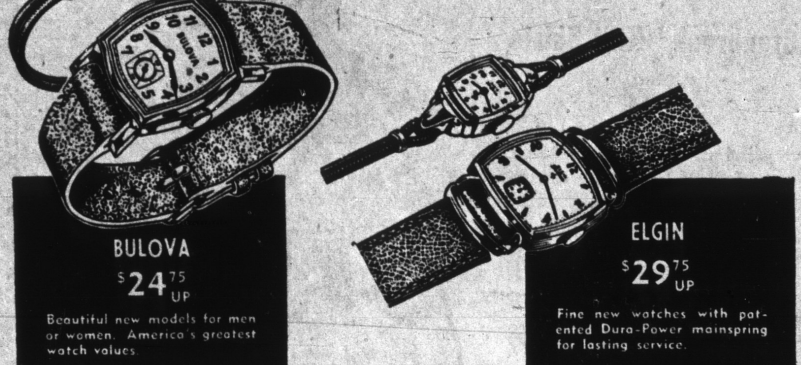

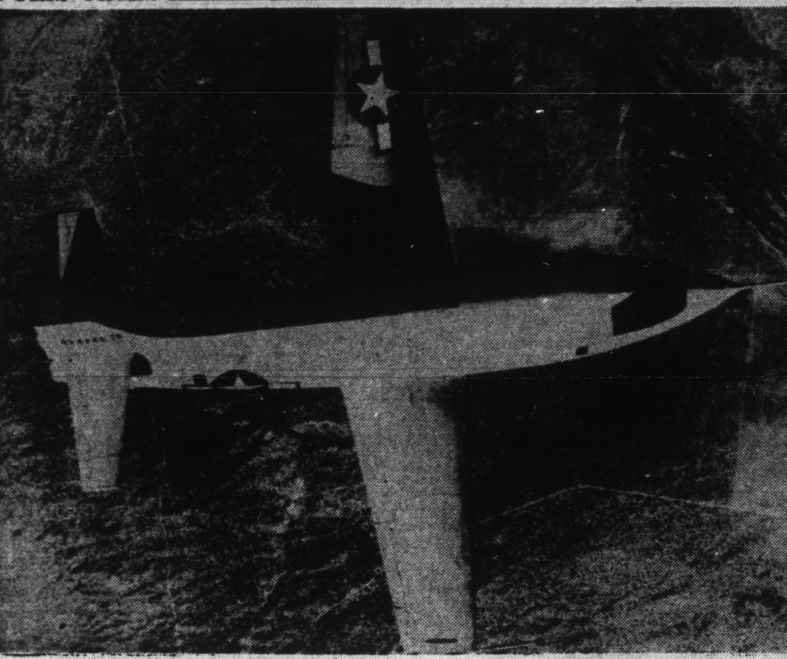
