## Lobster Pot Boy Tells Whale of a Tale About Willie the Kittenish Leviathan

PROVINCETOWN, Mass., June 28 (UPI)—A 17-year-old fisherman told of a whale of a fish story today. He said he rode a playful 60-foot monster bareback. And he had a chunk of the whale's blubber for proof.

"It was a funny feeling," said Frank Cabral Jr.

He said he was tending lobster pots off Race Point near Nantucket Island when the whale appeared and in a spirit or spurt of fun upset his dory. He said he lit sitting up on the whale's back and rode it until the Leviathan had disappeared.

His father, who was with him in another dory, confirmed the story.

## Headin' for Pa

"I saw the whale surface and he started for Pa's boat," young Cabral said. "It was Willie, a whale that has been playing around these fishing grounds for the past couple of summers."

"Willie was just gliding along smoothly like he was trying to sneak up on Pa. I shouted and it seemed as though the whale put on speed. He submerged,

rolling his big black back over like a porpoise.

"When he dived there was no doubt he was heading for Pa like a torpedo. Guess he misjudged his direction, because he came up right under me."

The youth said that the next thing he knew he was flying through the air and the dory had disappeared.

"I came down sitting up on his big, fat, slippery back," young Cabral said. "It was a funny feeling. I dug my fingers into his back and held on. I don't know how long I rode him."

"I heard Pa yell something and he started rowing like mad to catch me and the whale. But Willie was in a hurry. He started for the open sea north of Race Point."

"The spray was blinding me and I just closed my eyes and hoped he'd quit before I did. He didn't. Suddenly he pulled up short. He sounded and I knew he was going to dive, so I abandoned whale to starboard."

His father rescued him from the water and they found the other dory still afloat. However, the boat had a hole broken in it, and a piece of whale skin and blubber was still clinging to the shattered planking, the youth said.

"My boy is a Boy Scout," the elder Cabral added, to allay any skepticism. "He always tells the truth."
