

4 Men, Boy Held On Liquor Charge

Seized in Raids Over Week-End

'Stop the Music' Winner Plans Florida Dream Home

Wife of New York Cabbie Correctly Names Mystery Melody, Cops Windfall of Prizes

NEW YORK, June 28 (UP)—Mrs. Mary Farber, a 42-year-old grandmother, planned today to buy a dream house in Florida with the \$20,000 in prizes she won on the radio program "Stop the Music" (ABC).

She said she and her husband Milton, a taxi driver, had been saving money for a long time to West Palm Beach, but that until now she had never been sure the dream could become a reality.

"I hope I never have to drive a taxi again," said her husband.

Identifies Melody

Mrs. Farber, who has a married son and a grandson, correctly identified the "mystery melody" played on the radio show as "Get Out of the Wilderness."

She was the 100th person to try for the prize—the contestants being selected at random from the nation's telephone directories. She said she learned the name of the song from her brother, Max Lazarus of Stamford, Conn.

List of Prizes

The prizes she won included a 1948 Kaiser automobile, a \$1000 saving bond, a trailer, a television set, two suites of bedroom furniture, a complete house painting job, an electrical grandfather clock, a piano accordion, a food freezer, a clothes dryer, a \$1000 woman's wardrobe, a \$500 man's wardrobe, \$1000 diamond ring, a splint piano, six pieces of luggage, a complete kitchen, \$600 worth of women's hats, a home workshop, a Russian broadtail jacket and a 38-day cruise to South America.

The American Broadcasting Co., sponsor of the program, announced last week that it had been trying to give away the prize since early in May and asked that the name of the tune be publicized. The song, which sounds much the same as "The Old Gray Mare," is of pre-Civil War vintage.
