Cincinnati Opens 27th Season

CINCINNATI, O., June 28.—The rain which threatened the opening performance of the summer opera company last night was shamed into forbearance by the pleasant sound of Richard Strauss's "Der Rosenkavalier."

From the sold-out house came resounding noises of approval, sweeter than any music to those on the receiving end.

Strauss's ingratiating comedy of manners gave Cincinnati's 27th season opera a boost in the right direction.

The obvious good humor of the customers was proof that a change from the Italian ball and thunder school was welcome.

Tailored for Roles
Handsome mounted and costumed and conducted with quiet competence by Max Rudolf, last night's show had a glow that was infectious.

Rise Stevens, Irene Jenner and Emanuel List seemed tailored for their roles. They brought to the music all of the charm and facile humor of the decadent period it represents and sang their notes with musicianship and skill.

Miss Jenner's maturity took on grandness, and Mr. List, aided by his Rautenbach made a wonderful camp. Miss Stevens played Octavian with a judicious mixture of youth and sophistication and sang supremely well.

Mary Henderson joined with Octavian and the Marchallin (Miss Jenner) to give the third act trio in beautiful style. Thea Altmann sang Annina with skill and animation.

Impressive New Sets
Act one and two evoked the 18th century with new sets that were impressively baroque and the lighting seemed to be on a much more advanced level than in previous seasons.
