Judge Evan Evans Dies in Wisconsin

Veteran Federal
Jurist Was 72

Services for Judge Evan A. Evans, one of America's veteran Federal jurists who died in his Spring Green, Wis., home yesterday after a long illness, are expected to be held in Spring Green with burial beside his wife at Baraboo, Wis. He was 72.

Judge Evans of the Seventh United States Circuit Court of Appeals was in Indianapolis about a year and a half ago when he sat in one of the numerous "three judge" cases that brought him here.

Judge Evans last Friday relinquished his post as senior judge of the three-judge circuit comprising Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin after two long absences from the bench because of poor health. He retired to his farm in Spring Green where he planned to indulge in agriculture.

Outstanding Judge
Judge Robert C. Baltzell of the Federal Court in Indianapolis described Judge Evans as a close, personal friend throughout the 23 years they were acquainted. Judge Baltzell said that Judge Evans was one of the outstanding judges of the country and several times was considered for a Supreme Court appointment.

Judge Evans observed his 32d year as the circuit's senior judge last May after practicing law at nearby Baraboo for 16 years. He was graduated from Wisconsin University.

One of the most dramatic Indiana cases in which Judge Evans participated was a 1925 Gary bootleg conspiracy involving 75 defendants including city and county officials. He is survived by three sons, Evan A. Jr., professor of English at University of Idaho; Orin, professor of law at the University of Southern California; and George, a Milwaukee, Wis., attorney. Also surviving are a brother, Isaac C. of Spring Green, and a sister, Mrs. H. J. Steep of Baraboo.

Survivors are her husband, Thomas; her son, Donald, and her daughter, Judith.

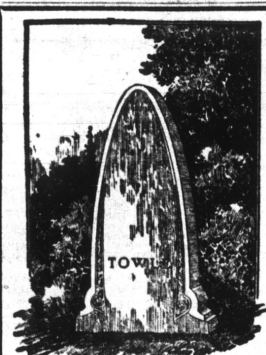

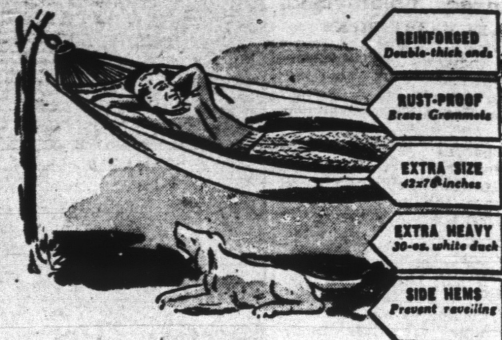

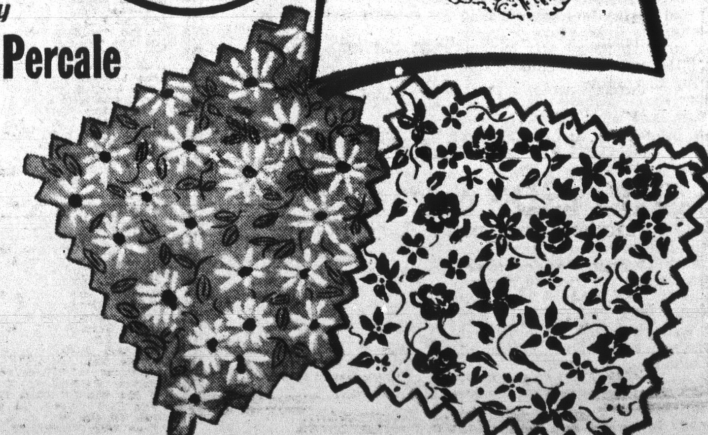
