

# Legislators Plan New Pay Fight

Seek Salaries Denied by Burch

Attorneys prepared today to renew the fight to win more than \$25,000 in back pay denied four state legislators on grounds they had violated the constitutional prohibition against dual job-holding.

On June 30 the Supreme Court held that State Auditor A. V. Burch was right in denying the state job salaries of the four. Prior to the decision State Sen. Clyde Black had put in \$9237 worth of work as secretary of the Flood Control Commission without receiving a cent of salary or expenses. Mr. Burch had contended for many months that none of the legislators could hold both their legislative posts and state jobs legally.


Others denied back pay were Rep. Charles Miser, former highway department engineer, \$7054; Rep. Elmer Waller, motor vehicle director for the Public Service Commission, \$5968, and Rep. Beecher Conrad, barber inspector, \$3014.

The case of a fifth legislator, Rep. Glenn Slenker who also holds the job as PSC public counselor, still is pending before the high court. Mr. Slenker's case differed from the others in that he resigned from the legislature, but Mr. Burch contended that he had been paid as a representative in advance and could not resign.

Attorneys in the four cases already decided said they would file a petition for rehearing in the supreme court before next Tuesday. At the same time they indicated other avenues were open by which the legislators might still obtain back pay although they would have to stick with the court order banning the dual jobs.

In a separate concurring opinion, Supreme Court Judge Mart J. O'Malley indicated that since the ruling reversed previous rulings and also a finding by the attorney general's office, the effects of it should not be retroactive.

The legislators also might appeal to the next general assembly for special appropriation to compensate them for services rendered without being in violation of the court order.

# Adolph Kruse Rites Tomorrow

Probation Chief Dies at Vincennes

VINCENNES, July 13—Services for Adolph H. (Cap) Kruse, retired organizer and chief of the federal probation system for Southern Indiana, will be held here tomorrow. He died here Monday at the age of 74.

Mr. Kruse, a Republican, also was a former Vincennes police chief and Knox County sheriff. Before retiring in 1945, he had served 12 years as chief probation officer of the U. S. District Court of Southern Indiana. Previously he was a temporary bailiff in the Federal Court in Indianapolis.

Born in Freelandville, he came here in his youth, joined the police department, and worked his way up from patrolman to chief. Later, as Knox County sheriff, he directed rescue work in the historic 1913 flood.

He was a veteran of both the Spanish-American War and World War I, in which he was commissioned a captain in a pioneer infantry company in France.

He had lived here with his daughter, Mrs. Mildred Winstanley. Other survivors are a son, Robert S. Kruse, and a daughter, Miss Frances Kruse, both of Indianapolis.

# Mrs. Emma Scharr Dies Here at 71

Mrs. Emma Scharr, Gary, died today at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Frank Duggan, 3340 N. Meridian St. She was 71.
