That's the kind of an ad the County Welfare Board might run to find a successor to Arthur E. Wooden, deceased county welfare director.

If that's the way new directors were selected—and if the board wanted to give a true picture of what the applicants were getting into—it might add a few more lines reading:

**List Qualifications**  
Candidates must be able to get along with professional social workers with spendthrift notions and budget-minded business men with opposite leanings. Tight rope walking experience and ability to carry water on both shoulders considered assets.

## Army Officials Agree Segregation Will End

**WASHINGTON, July 30 (UP)**—Army officials agreed today that segregation of Negro and white troops eventually will be eliminated.

But for the present, they said, they are going to continue their long-established practice of putting Negro enlisted men in separate companies.

Mr. Truman told a press conference yesterday that he envisioned an eventual end to segregation when he issued his recent order for "equality of treatment and opportunity for all persons in the armed services," regardless of race or religion.

In its official announcement of the examination the board set up certain qualifications and pointed out that the salary range would be between \$4800 and \$6300, to be set by the county board.

# 8 Dairy Firms Indicted by U. S.

**Chicago Action Follows Price Structure Probe**

**CHICAGO, July 30 (UP)**—A federal grand jury investigating cost-of-living price structures in Chicago area today indicted eight major dairies and 13 officials of the companies.

The grand jury, which has been investigating prices since September, 1947, returned three indictments before Federal Judge John P. Barnes.

One indictment charging violation of the Sherman anti-trust act, named eight dairy companies and nine individuals. The other indictments, charging violation of the Robinson-Patman Act through the giving of rebates, named respectively a dairy company and two individuals and another dairy company and six individuals.

The Bowman Dairy Co., Borden, the Beloit Dairy Co., the Capital Dairy Co., the Hurd Dairy Co., Meadowmoor Dairies Inc., the Western United Dairy Co., and the American Processing and Sales Co., and various officers were charged with Sherman anti-trust act violation.

**Wholesale Outlets**  
For seven years, the indictment charges, these companies unlawfully allocated wholesale outlets of fluid milk for their own mutual satisfaction in the Chicago area, thus enabling them to keep milk prices up.

In the second indictment, the Borden Co. was charged with violating the Robinson-Patman Act through the payment of \$792,000 rebated to the Atlantic & Pacific Tea Co., chain food merchants, for the years 1942 through 1947, and of \$885,000 to the Jewel Tea Co. for the same years.

This indictment charged that the defendants entered into contracts for rebates and discriminated against competitors, giving discounts to customers.

Seaman Kattau is serving aboard a landing ship, one of eight making up the supply fleet. Supplies totaling 37,000 tons of cargo ranging from paper clips to huge cranes will be handled by Seaman Kattau and others of the expedition.

A year's complete supply is threaded through an ice-bordered channel to be distributed to men stationed in several camps in an area of 35,000 square miles.
