

U. S., Colombia Study New Canal

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (UP)—The United States and Colombia have agreed to conduct a preliminary survey for a proposed new inter-ocean canal through Colombia, the State Department disclosed today.

It said a preliminary reconnaissance by air, land and water will be undertaken within two months to determine costs which would be compared with costs of other possible canal routes.


