

GOP Drafts Its Own Anti-Inflation And Housing Aid Bills

Ignore Many Of Truman's Suggestions

Expect to Adjourn Within Week

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (UP)—Republican leaders came up today with their own anti-inflation and housing bills which they hope to push through Congress before adjourning within the next week.

The bills bear little resemblance to President Truman's sweeping recommendations for curbing high prices and relieving the housing shortage. Only two of the President's anti-inflation proposals—controls on consumer credit and on bank lending—are included in the GOP measure.

That bill was slated for approval today by the House Banking Committee. The House probably will stamp its okay on it tomorrow.

The GOP minds were made up. But Mr. Truman asked Democratic leaders in a White House conference today to "do everything possible" to push his broad legislative program.

The President met for an hour with Sens. Alben W. Barkley of Kentucky and Scott Lucas of Illinois and Reps. Sam Rayburn of Texas and John McCracken of Massachusetts.

Afterward, Mr. Barkley told reporters that the President thinks his full program "is necessary."

"And I think it would be bad for the country for Congress to adjourn without acting on the President's program," Mr. Barkley said.

Work on Housing Bill
A Senate-House subcommittee, meanwhile, went to work on details of a watered-down housing bill that will be brought up in the Senate shortly.

The Republican bill does not contain any provision for public housing, slum clearance or other controversial features of the Fair Housing Act which the President endorsed. It is intended chiefly to furnish incentives and credit aids to private builders.

The anti-inflation and housing bills, drawn up by the GOP leadership, brought angry but futile protests from a group of Republican "young Turks" who charged that the legislation "just isn't enough." They planned to take their case to a meeting of the Senate's 51 Republicans later today, but the leadership's views were certain to prevail.

Sen. Robert A. Taft (R., O.), who had a big hand in drafting the GOP proposals, said he doubts whether they can be acted on by Saturday, as originally planned. He said adjournment of the special session may have to be postponed until "early next week."

The leadership's schedule did not include any civil rights measures, indicating that Republicans are ready to drop their so far unsuccessful fight against a southern filibuster on the anti-poll tax bill.

Buying Controls

The GOP anti-inflation measure would:

ONE: Restore controls on installment buying, as voted last year by the Senate. Buyers would be required to pay one-third down on "consumer durables" such as stoves, refrigerators, and automobiles, and the rest over a period of about 18 months.

THREE: Authorize the Federal Reserve Board to raise reserve requirements for member banks one per cent on time deposits and three per cent on demand deposits. Mr. Truman asked for four and one per cent.

THREE: Require the government to maintain a gold reserve of 40 per cent behind federal reserve notes. Present required reserve is 25 per cent. But the government has more than \$23 billion worth of gold buried at Ft. Knox, Ky., almost enough to back federal reserve paper money 100 per cent.

Wooded and Won by Remote Control, Pretty Fraulein Prepares to Become 'War Bride'

BERLIN, Aug. 4 (UP)—Pretty Ingeborg Schluter, who was wooed and won by remote control, prepared today for a trip to England where she will marry her ex-GI sweetheart this week-end.

"When one really is in love, nothing is impossible," she said in commenting on her romance with 33-year-old Joseph Conti of Richmond, Ind., a sweetheart she has never seen. She was thinking of the British visa in her purse and the promise of a British European Airlines ticket that would take her to England and start her on the way to America as a "war bride."

Eight months ago the American consulate in Berlin told Ingeborg the matrimonial plans she and Joe had worked out by mail were "out of the question—impossible."

"Never Gave Up"
Joe had attempted to bring her to the United States under the "GI sweetheart act." Unromantic consulate officials said no grounds the law wasn't intended to facilitate "love by remote control."

"But we never gave up hoping and trying," she said. "Now I'm promised I can fly to England and meet Joe on Thursday." The former GI now is aboard the U. S. Marine Falcon, en route to Southampton, where he will meet his fiancée for the first time.

BUDAPEST, Aug. 4—Wherever you look in this city you see colorful slogans boasting Hungary's Three-Year Plan. "Three-Year Plan—Well Being," says one. "Three-Year Plan Is Your Plan, Work for It." And on the bulletin board at the Goldberger textile factory at Obuda, in the outskirts: "Dear Competitor, Here We Have a Working Competition, Not a Chatting Competition."

The Three-Year Plan is designed to increase coal output 38 per cent, machinery production 168 per cent, power 43 per cent, chemical products 40 per cent. Its aim is to improve the prewar living standard by 14 per cent. Every effort is being made to reach these goals in two and a half years. Authorities say proudly that coal, iron and steel production already have passed prewar levels.

5-Year Plan Slated
When this plan is ended, a Five-Year Plan with new targets is to be started.

It was necessary to establish a Three-Year Plan, said a government spokesman, "because war destruction and damage had brought living standards to a level so low that recovery could not be left to natural forces."

The Goldberger plant employs 650 women and about 100 men. It was nationalized in August, 1947, along with heavy industry, mines and banks.

Its monthly output is about 2,700,000 yards of cotton and rayon goods. Besides supplying the domestic market, quantities of the cloth go to Switzerland, England, Russia and metropolitan France.

The greatest problem is dyes, which used to come from I. G. Farben and now must be imported from the U. S. and Switzerland. Russia supplies raw cotton.

Attractive 21-year-old Rosa Kelascheck is one of the "shock workers" among the women. She had worked as a checker for two years.

Lens Plant Hits 50% Production

Guard Keeps Order As Workers Return

DATON, O., Aug. 4 (UP)—With the National Guard maintaining order, production at the strike-bound Univis Lens plant reached 50 per cent of capacity today.

Vice President Frank Welling said 464 of the company's 650 employees had returned to work.

Guardmen, who used armored equipment, bayonets and tear gas to break up a jeering crowd at the plant yesterday, were accused of "police brutality" by the striking CIO United Electrical Workers union.

The union lodged a formal protest with Gov. Thomas J. Herbert for ordering out the guard.

Union Plans Parley

The UE ended a policy meeting shortly after midnight and announced another session at CIO headquarters today. Leaders of the two largest UE union locals here—Delco and Frigidaire—said they would urge their members to attend.

However, Chairman George Moyer of the Montgomery County Council of Industrial Unions said he would have nothing to do with the meeting and would not send members of his group to it.

Set Picket Activities

Herbert Herschberg, Cleveland, director of the Ohio-Kentucky Region for the electrical workers, said last night's meeting was not for asking further negotiations, but for revising picket schedules and "to intensify activities."

UE lost a recent NLRB election at Univis but leaders contended they still represented the employees because they had not been officially notified of the union's decertification.

Bandits Get \$183 At Grocery Store

Two nonchalant bandits held up a grocery at 2905 Clifton St. early today and escaped with \$183.

Charles Stroud, 30, owner of Stroud's Market, said the men stroled in shortly after he had opened and ordered a quart of milk.

As he turned toward the refrigerator, they both drew pistols, and one drawled, "hold it." They then forced him to pour the cash into a small cloth sack and instructed him to lie on the floor in a rear room.

"Stay there until you hear the door slam," the gunmen warned. Mr. Stroud heard the door shut after about five minutes. That's when he called police.

New Invention Rings Buzzer When Fish Bites

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4—An electrical gadget that can be a good friend both to the very lazy fisherman and the very busy one has been invented by Antoni Linder of Chicago, and is covered by a U. S. patent.

It is built essentially like a door or desk buzzer, only instead of having a button to push it has a hook to pull. The fisherman's line is made fast to this hook, and when a fish bites, the tug transmitted through the line closes the contact and sounds the buzzer.

THE LAZY vacationing fisherman, with one line out, can lean back and snooze, or sit up and play bridge or engage in whatever other activity may be going on abroad, until the buzzer sounds.

On the other hand, the busy commercial fisherman, who may have a dozen or more lines out at once, will be notified by the buzzer whenever a fish is waiting to be hauled in.
