# Rex Barney Hurls 2-0 No-Hitter for Bums

Only 4 Giant Batters Reach 1st, Two on Walks, Two on Errors

NEW YORK, Sept. 10—Right-hander Rex Barney of Brooklyn, once regarded as "just a thrower" joined the most prominent pitchers in the National League today after fashioning a brilliant no-hit, no-run game against the hard-hitting New York Giants.

The 23-year-old fast-baller from men as he defeated the Giants, 2 to 0, last night in a game punctuated by intermittent rain and witnessed by 36,324 fans. Only four Giant batters reached base, two on errors and two on walks.

Barney, hampered by wildness earlier in the season, retired the last 20 men to face him and pitched the last three innings in a steady rain. Brooklyn garnered its first run off Monty Kennedy in the second on Carl Furillo's single, Pee Wee Reese's double and Gil Hodges' grounder to deep short. The Dodgers scored their second run in the third when Furillo, who collected three of his team's six hits, singled home Bill Cox. The victory was Barney's 13th of the season.

The second-place Pittsburgh Pirates, continuing their march toward the top, won their fifth in a row by beating the Cincinnati Reds, 6 to 1. Veteran Elmer Riddle scattered five hits and breeded to his 12th victory. Cincinnati manager-pitcher Bucky Walters sought the 19th victory of his career but yielded to Harry Gumbert in the sixth when the Pirates pushed across three runs. Clyde Kluttz homered for the Bucs in the eighth with none on.

Va., sophomore, and Lawrence Jones, Ottawa, Ill., junior, at ends; Fran Rath, Indianapolis sophomore, and Tom Wright, Louisville sophomore, tackles; Ray McSemek, East Chicago junior and Charles Maternowski, South Bend sophomore, guards, and Ott Hurle, Indianapolis senior and last year's captain, center.

The backfield will be Ed Fike, Louisville junior, at quarterback; Kenny Smock, Indianapolis senior, left half; James Warrenburg, Indianapolis junior, right half, and Flavian Weidekamp, Indianapolis sophomore, fullback.
