







Muncie Worker
Declared FreeArkansas Extradition
Denied by Gates

John Ware, Muncie foundry worker sought by Arkansas as a parole violator, a free man at last.

Gov. Gates yesterday reversed an earlier decision and denied extradition of the Muncie Negro to Arkansas after The Times told Mr. Ware's story. His action followed a Delaware Circuit Court decision holding that Mr. Ware was not a fugitive from justice and that Arkansas had no claim on him.

Until Wednesday, Mr. Ware had been held in protective custody in Muncie after charging Arkansas authorities virtually kidnapped him to bring him to Indianapolis for extradition proceedings. The Governor issued an extradition warrant about three weeks ago but withdrew it after Mr. Ware's charge was made to await court developments.

Muncie Record Good

The Muncie man was convicted of shooting a white man who came to his farm in Arkansas years ago. He served 10 years and then was paroled to a sponsor for whom he had to work for \$1.50 a day.

Under the impression that his parole period was for only six months, he came to Muncie about two years ago where he established a record as a church-going, hard-working citizen.

In denying extradition, Gov. Gates held that while a governor had no authority to dig into the merits of Mr. Ware's trial and parole in Arkansas, the court had such authority. He pointed out in his statement denying the warrant that the court apparently had found grounds for its ruling that Mr. Ware was not a fugitive from justice and that he had not violated his Arkansas parole.


